

Multicultural Mass – Migrant and Refugee Sunday -Sunday September 26 at 2.30pm in St Francis Xavier Cathedral, Adelaide.

Each year, we come together to celebrate the contributions of all the different communities in our Archdiocese. This year on the 107th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, we celebrate our annual Multicultural Mass. The Mass will be livestreamed, as there is limited capacity in the Cathedral. Be Opened!

"Ephphatha!"— that is, "Be opened!" Mark 7:34b

These are powerful words. They are words that actually accomplish what they say. These words are spoken by Jesus after the deaf man is brought to Him with the request for healing. By saying the command "Be opened!", the deaf man's ears are opened and his speech impediment is removed. This man had a physical problem which prevented him from hearing or speaking. Think how difficult communication must have been for him.

God also wants to speak with us. Like the deaf man, we might have some issues which make it difficult for us to understand God. When Jesus speaks, His word changes things. This is true in this story, but it is also true in our lives. We all are deaf and struggle with a speech impediment in the sense that we do not always hear the voice of God and we do not always speak His word and words of charity.

Sometimes our deafness is due to how busy we are. We just don't have time to listen to God. We brush Him aside as we hurry on to our next activity. Sometimes our prejudices and preconceptions prevent us from hearing what God is speaking to us. We don't listen because we think we already have the answers. We are not open to what God is trying to communicate with us.

At other times, we seem to have a speech impediment, like the deaf man. We know what God has to say, but we don't pass it on to those around us. God's Word makes it to our ears, but we are too timid or afraid to speak it to others.

Remember that God loves us and wants to direct us along the right path. This week, ask God what He wants us to hear. We must let Him take us off to a quiet place alone and speak to us. We must let Him say those words to us. "Ephphatha!—Be opened!" Let our Lord open the "ears" of our heart so that we can hear all that He wishes to say to us. Once that happens, Jesus will also help us speak His words of truth and love.

Try to actively listen to God. Spend some time in prayer. Read scripture or just sit in silence. Notice God speaking to us through nature. Just try to be aware of where we see God in our life and consider what message might be found there. Receive that message openly, without stress or anxiety. If we are not sure what it means, just keep it in our heart, trusting that God will reveal more when the time is right.
