To be near God is my happiness, to place my hope in God the Lord.

REFLECTIONS- In today's Gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. His words and images draw upon Old Testament imagery, especially images found in the Book of Daniel. Next, Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. Jesus also teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come, except the Father. In the verses that follow this reading in Mark's Gospel, Jesus continues to warn his disciples to be on watch for this end time. Jesus' words are not spoken to frighten his disciples, nor should they frighten us. Rather, they are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes and at the end times. Our consolation and hope is found in the lasting nature of Jesus' words and God's never-ending love for

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." Mark 13:31

Yes, it is true. Heaven as it is now and Earth as it is now will pass away. The Gospels and the Book of Revelation speak to this truth. As we draw close to the end of this liturgical year, we are reminded of this fact. We are reminded that Jesus will return in splendour and glory and will make all things new. The world as we know it will be made anew, and Heaven will be joined to this new Earth, and all will be one. Jesus will reign in this new world as the glorious King of all. One thing this tells us is that we should not become overly attached to the things of this passing world. True, earthly wealth and possessions may offer a temporary satisfaction to our lives, but never a permanent satisfaction. In time, the things of this world will all disappear. So, if we work to build up only earthly wealth and possessions, we should know that all those things will eventually pass away, and we would be left with nothing. We are asked to live very every day of our lives in loving God in Himself and in loving others by our committed service. So do not procrastinate, tomorrow may be too late. Live each day as if it were our last. Do the good we can today and let go of any regrets because we may not have the opportunity again tomorrow. Make each day count. Jesus comes to us every day in ordinary events of life and in the Eucharist let us welcome Him into our lives. Let us look to the future with hope and serenity because Jesus, who sits forever at God's right hand, is the mediator who has secured the forgiveness of our sins and our sanctification through his sacrifice on the cross as we heard in the second reading. May God give us the grace to live our lives in a way pleasing to Him; Using every opportunity we have to do good to others, and to make heaven as our reward.
