MIND MASSES AT HECTORVILLE PARISH-

Dear Parishioners, since 24th February 2022 the Parish has not been taking any Mind Mass bookings. Please note that we will continue to be unable to take any Mind Mass bookings until after Easter. This is due to the unavailability of Priests in our Parish as well as in the Archdiocese. Priests have fallen to COVID and others have gone on leave since travel restrictions were eased. All of this together has resulted in a shortage of priests. Our Parish is also currently limited in providing services as we only have one Priest available to cover all existing Parish requirements. If anything changes with the availability of priests, we will revisit the situation and let you know more. Thank you for your understanding.

CTK MEETING ROOM PRAYER GROUPS AND MEETINGS

Dear Parishioners, The CTK Meeting room has not been available for the past month or so for any of the Parish prayer groups and meetings. PETITION CROSS-From Second Sunday of Lent until Good Friday, the Petition Cross will again be placed lying down at the front of the Church of the Annunciation. After Good Friday, the petitions will be discreetly removed, gathered together and offered up at Mass.

Holy Places Appeal –Good Friday April 15, 2022 -The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on **Good Friday, April 15 after Holy Communion** at all Masses. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as Health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from this collection. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land on Good Friday and please keep them in your prayers. North Street Chapel Restoration Project

Dear Parishioners

For years the Parish has desired to restore the original Parish Chapel in North Street. This building and land is owned by the Parish. Due to its significantly deteriorated condition and Heritage classification, the cost of restoration has always been way beyond the Parish's capability.

In recent times, the School and Parish have had discussions regarding the restoration. As the School is about to undertake a significant expansion and refurbishment project on the school site over the next three years, the School have offered to also undertake a refurbishment of the Chapel. Via a process of negotiation and consultation, the School will restore the Chapel, inside and out. The outside will be restored to its former glory with much of the original appearance and structure reinstated. The inside will be restored to a useable open space whilst also giving justice to the religious significance as a Chapel and honouring Saint Mary MacKillop.

Ultimately the Parish's desire is to own its own Parish Community Centre. Until then and once the Chapel refurbishment is finished, the Chapel will be used by the Parish to run our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program in it. This will be the case for a few years and until the Parish has its own Community Centre. The Parish will continue to own the land and the Chapel once refurbished. Once the Parish no longer uses the Chapel, the School will make use of it on a daily basis with the Parish still able to use it to celebrate significant and relevant religious occasions.

This is a truly significant and celebrated arrangement with the School as there is no way that the Chapel would ever have been restored by the Parish alone as we could not afford to do so.

Works will commence within weeks and I trust that you will look forward to the transformation, as will we.

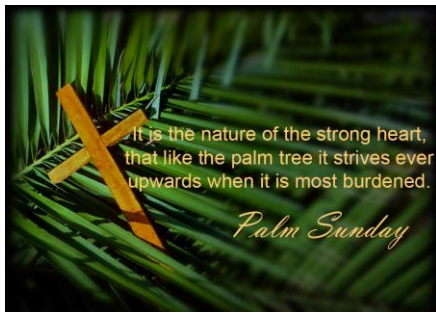

PALM SUNDAY

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week,

and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday.

The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war. A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These may be returned to the church, or kept for the year.

Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the follow year's Ash Wednesday observance.

The colors of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.
