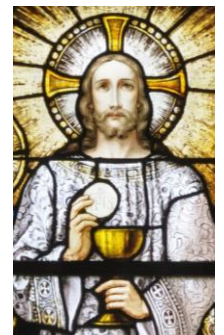
GOSPEL

The Body and Blood of Christ – Corpus Christi

Today's Feast is about the bountiful generosity of God and it is also about the deepest description of who we are as the Church; we are the Body of Christ.

Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are remembering in a sacred and profound way the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus; the Paschal Mystery. This is not some drama at which we are silent and passive observers. The Church document on the liturgy calls us to be Full, Conscious and Active participants in the celebration of the Eucharist at all times.

During the celebration of the Eucharist, we present the most ordinary of things to God; bread and wine; fruit of the earth and work of our hands. God accepts, blesses them and then through power of the Holy Spirit they become the Body and Blood of Jesus. God then surprises us even more and returns these new gifts to us out of love. The Eucharist is an expression God's ultimate bountiful generosity. Our response can only be gratitude which is why when we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, we prayerfully respond, Amen. May we never take this greatest of gifts for granted. We didn't earn, it's not our right and we can't demand it. It is God's gift given freely out love to each of us. As Pope Francis reminds us; "The Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and nourishment form the weak." (The Joy of the Gospel: 47).

At the meal we call the Last Supper during which he first offered himself to us through the breaking of bread and pouring of wine, he asked that when whenever we do this we are to do it in memory of him. At this same meal he also took the place of a servant, washed our feet and asked us to do the same for each other; we are to serve each other. We can't do one without the other. Because we have shared in the Eucharist with each other, we are called and challenged by Jesus to care for and serve each other. If we celebrate the Body and Blood of Jesus in memory of Jesus, we are also to serve each other in memory of Jesus. We can't do one without doing the other!

At end of mass, we hear words, Go now to love and serve the Lord. This is the invitation and challenge presented to each of us precisely because we have celebrated the eucharist with each other. We are to take what we have experienced around the altar out and live it in our ordinary lives with each other: The love of God made visible through the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Sacramental Program

We are now taking enrolments for our Sacramental Program. This is a one-year program, for children in Year 3 or older, starting in Term 3 this year.



Term 3 and 4, 2022

Your child will first receive general Catechesis instruction, to help them gain a greater understanding of who Jesus is, and what we believe in our Church.

Term 1 and 2, 2023

We will give an overview of all the Sacraments, and then your child will be prepared for the Sacrament of Reconciliation to be received in Term 1, 2023.

We follow the Church's Confirmation and First Eucharist Programs, to prepare your child for receiving these important Sacraments around the end of Term 2, 2023.

Ceremony dates change from year to year, but are generally held in the middle of the year.

Session times: Sunday mornings, 9.30am – 10.30am

Cost: \$150 for the whole course, which covers the cost of a Youth Bible, Catechesis books, photocopied materials and Ceremonial expenses.
