## TODAY'S READINGS AND GOSPEL REFLECTION

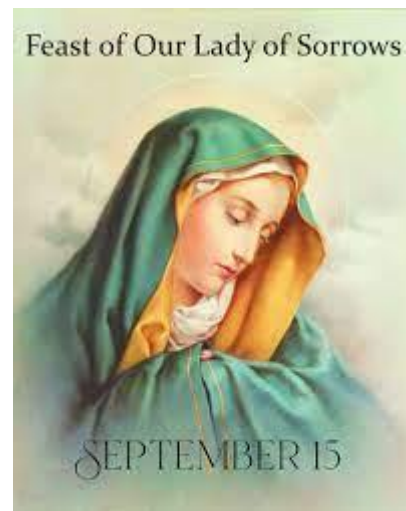


From our earliest days we have been told that people in authority shouldn't have favourites. If someone receives 'special treatment' others will complain about unfairness and prejudice. But the readings of this Sunday show that God very clearly 'favours' one group of people. All those who are poor, needy, lonely and disadvantaged will be the ones whose prayers are answered first. God never forgets those who help his favoured people and encourages us to praise the Lord in all of life's circumstances. It is eye-opening to realise that God, whom we may think of as being 'up high', takes an interest in the lives of those who are 'low down'. All the promises about the kingdom of God, which were fulfilled in the person of Jesus, become clear and visible.

Only those who, like Jesus, are willing to do what they can to help others, live according to God's plans. But to choose God instead of fame, money or any other possession is not only an act of our will. God encourages us to rely on him, to draw our energy and enthusiasm from his power and use every possible opportunity to bring people to him. Our astuteness should be expressed in our eagerness to choose the good over bad and others over ourselves. This is a much greater challenge than working out how to spend our money responsibly.

"When money talks, the truth is silent." Nowadays, truth is silent because people consider money as more important than anything else. This is why Pope John Paul II said: "The greatest misfortune of this age is that people consider money as the highest good." They do everything to have more money. This is the cause of so much trouble in our society. And when the truth is silenced because people are bought by money, then freedom is also lost, and subsequently, even human dignity is lost. In short, when people serve man, and not God they become slaves, without freedom and dignity. If people serve God they live in true freedom and sublime dignity as inheritors of His kingdom. Consequently, life in society becomes more peaceful and harmonious. Only obedience to God, and not money, is the way to peace, happiness and true prosperity.

## OUR LADY OF SORROWS



This week we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady Of Sorrows. The title, Our Lady of Sorrows, given to our Blessed Mother focuses on her intense suffering and grief during the passion and death of our Lord. Traditionally, this suffering was not limited to the passion and death event; rather, it comprised of the seven sorrows of Mary, which were foretold by the Priest Simeon who proclaimed to Mary, This Child (Jesus) is destined to be the downfall and the rise of many in Israel, a sign that will be opposed and you yourself shall be pierced with a sword so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare (Luke 2:34-35). These seven sorrows of our Blessed Mother included the flight of the Holy Family into Egypt; the loss and finding of the child Jesus in the Temple; Mary's meeting of Jesus on His way to Calvary; Mary's standing at the foot of the cross when our Lord was crucified; her holding of Jesus when He was taken down from the cross and then our Lord's burial. In all, the prophesy of Simeon that a sword would pierce our Blessed Mother's heart was fulfilled in these events. For this reason, Mary is sometimes depicted with her heart exposed and with seven swords piercing it. More importantly, each new suffering was received with the courage, love, and trust that echoed her fiat, let it be done unto me according to Thy word, first uttered at the Annunciation.

Focusing on the compassion of our Blessed Mother, Pope John Paul II, reminded the faithful, Mary Most Holy goes on being the loving consoler of those touched by the many physical and moral sorrows which afflict and torment humanity. She knows our sorrows and our pains, because she too suffered, from Bethlehem to Calvary.
