REFLECTION

Today’s readings tell of a reversal of fortunes. They tell us that God will upset our notion of how the world should work. Those who have plenty will suffer. Those who suffer will know fullness of life. This is a message that Jesus comes back to often. Riches, esteem and the things of this world must not distract us from serving God and his people. The rich man was so focused on his own comfort that he did nothing to help the starving Lazarus whom he saw every day. The law in the Old Testament made it clear that caring for those less fortunate needs to be a priority.

TODAY'S GOSPEL REFLECTION



From one perspective, Lazarus was existing in a very undesirable state. He was poor, starving, and miserable. He was covered with sores that dogs would lick. This is very descriptive language used by Jesus and it's helpful to do your best to imagine this miserable physical state that Lazarus was in.

The key to this story is that even though Lazarus was in a miserable physical condition, his soul was in the hands of God. We know that to be true, because we are told that when he died, he was "carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham" ([Luke 16:22](#)).

This story provides us all with an opportunity to look at what is most important in life. The rich man had all he wanted in this life but clearly lacked charity on account of the fact that he ignored the physical needs of Lazarus. For that reason, the rich man was spiritually impoverished, whereas Lazarus was spiritually prosperous.

When you can keep your eyes on what is most important in life, spiritual wealth, it will make the many other hardships you endure less burdensome. Perhaps you will never be in the same physical condition as Lazarus, but you may encounter other great pains and hardships in life. When this happens, the tendency may be to become fixated upon those sufferings and to take your eyes off your interior union with God.

Reflect, today, upon how you would deal with living like Lazarus. Reflect upon what your own "sores" are in life. They may be varied in type, degree and number from those of other people's sufferings, but they will be encountered in your life. As you identify your suffering, turn your eyes from it to the presence of God in your soul, and allow His presence to fill you with the riches of His grace.

Lord, I offer to You my suffering and pain, my misery and hurt. Help me to always keep my eyes on You and to seek satisfaction only in the riches of Heaven. Fill my heart, especially, with love of You and charity for others so that I will be truly rich in what matters most. Jesus, I trust in You.

OUR LADY OF MEDJUGORJE



Medjugorje is one of the most visited "active" apparition sites in the world. The first apparition occurred in 1981, when Our Lady appeared to six Children aged 10-16. Our holy Mother has been appearing there now for over 40 years. In May of 2017, a commission established by Pope Benedict XVI concluded its investigation. The commission overwhelmingly voted in favor of recognizing the supernatural nature of the first seven apparitions.

In December of that year, Pope Francis lifted a moratorium on diocesan organized pilgrimages, essentially elevating Medjugorje to shrine status.

Vatican envoy Archbishop Henry Hoser was also appointed by the Pope to oversee the care of pilgrims there, declaring in July 2018 that the little village is "a source of grace for the whole world."

In a personal conversation with Bishop Pavel Hnilica, Pope John Paul II stated, "***Medjugorje is a continuation, an extension of Fatima.***"

To date, the apparitions and accompanying graces have produced over four hundred documented healings, hundreds of vocations to the priesthood, thousands of ministries worldwide, and countless and often dramatic conversions.

The messages of Medjugorje are a call to conversion, conversion back to God. Our Lady's purpose for coming to Earth is to guide each one of us back to her Son Jesus. She does this by leading us, step by step, toward a life of holiness through the hundreds of messages she has given to the world through the 6 visionaries in Medjugorje over 41 years.

The time for decision is NOW. Our Lady's call is URGENT! We must open our hearts and begin to change our lives starting today. For more information simply search "Medjugorje" on YouTube and you will find a mountain of information.
