5th March 2023

REFLECTION

Lent is meant to be fundamentally a good experience because the established Lenten practices facilitate our ongoing conversion to the Gospel. So our prayer during Lent needs to be enthusiastically similar to the words spoken by Peter to Jesus during the Transfiguration: 'Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here' (Mt 17:4). Lent offers us a yearly opportunity to undergo conversion from sin. It is only when we abandon sin that we can truly begin the pursuit of authentic happiness and experience the joy of the saints in our lives. Sin alienates us from God and, often, from other people. So it is imperative that we eradicate it from our lives. Then we are drawn closer to Jesus and that is our purpose here on earth — to become close to Jesus because God made us to know, love and serve him in this world so that we may be happy with him forever in heaven.

PROJECT COMPASSION



Tereesa is a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stability for her children.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community.

Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.

-The Curate's Corner-

Our Lenten readings urge us to pray, fast and give alms. But what does it actually mean to do these things? and how might we do them in our lives? Over the next three weeks we will have a look at each of these disciplines and hopefully gain a better understanding of how we might practice them in our lives.

-Prayer-

St Therese of Lisieux once said, "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy."

This simple and sweet definition reminds us that prayer is nothing other than a living relationship with the living God. It is not a monologue or a therapy session, but simply our heart speaking to his heart. Yes, we recite certain prayers again and again like the Mass and the Rosary, but that is because these are privileged ways of bringing us into God's presence.

But let's be honest, sometimes it's really hard to pray, we just don't know where to begin. Well, here Cardinal Sarah's words are helpful. He says, "the deepest means for contemplation is what is before you." That means I can encounter Christ wherever I am. So, if I'm stuck in traffic, if I'm cooking dinner, I can find God there because he's not absent from anything I do. Every moment of my day can be a moment for prayer.

So how might we pray better this week? Well let's notice that the noise and activity of our day don't have to be a distraction but can be an entrance into prayer. Every vocation lends itself to a prayer life because God wants to enter every human heart. So, this week let's try to bring God into even the most ordinary moments of our day.
