12th March 2023

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

For anyone who drinks it, says the Lord, the water I shall give will become in him a spring welling up to eternal life.

REFLECTION

Within the heat of the day, Jesus spoke lovingly to this woman and said, "Give me a drink." Saint Augustine states that, symbolically speaking, Jesus thirsted for her soul, for her salvation. He longed to give her the grace soon to be won through His Cross. Her willing reception of this gift would also bring satiation to the Heart of our Lord. Jesus didn't dwell upon her past; He knew all about it. He could read her soul. All He wanted to do was to rummage through the sin and rubbish that was cluttering her soul so as to discover her dignity within. If she were to allow Jesus to offer her this mercy, not only would she receive true Living Water to quench her spiritual thirst, she would also satiate the spiritual thirst in the soul of our Lord that could only be satiated by the dispensing of His mercy.

PROJECT COMPASSION



Priscilla lives in the Hwange

district in Zimbabwe with her husband, Charles, and their two grandsons. Climate change continues to bring unprecedented challenges for people living in the most vulnerable and remote communities in Zimbabwe.

With the support of Caritas Hwange, Priscilla learnt conservation farming skills to grow drought-resistant crops to support her family during the current food crisis. Priscilla was able to produce a bumper harvest in her first year of practising conservation farming. Priscilla used the funds from her harvest to start poultry farming, which enabled her to sell eggs to pay for her grandchildren's school fees, books and stationery. The poultry farming provides a safety net for Priscilla and her family during times of hardship, like the current drought.

While the situation in Zimbabwe and across eastern Africa remains dire, the work of Caritas Hwange means that Priscilla can learn the skills she needs to build resilience and support her family during this current food crisis.

-The Curate's Corner-

This week we turn to fasting, and right away we need to be honest and say that fasting is hard, and we don't really like doing it. But why did Christ fast so often himself and why is he so insistent on us fasting? Well, we've all had the experience that the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak; that we do the things we don't want to do. And that's why we fast. It's about love and training ourselves to choose what's good for our relationship with Christ, even when it's hard. To remind ourselves that even though we are wounded by sin we can still choose him. So that's why we fast but what does fasting look like? and when are we meant to fast?

-Fasting-

In Australia Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. But if possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until Holy Saturday night to honour the suffering and death of our Lord and to prepare for his Resurrection. This is the minimum required of a Catholic but certainly we are encouraged to make this a regular spiritual practice.

Fasting means eating only one full meal and two smaller meals which, combined, would not equal a single normal meal.

And who's required to fast? Those aged 18-59, and in reasonable health. The Church does not ask the impossible, so exemptions are given to children, adults with physical and mental illness, pregnant women and those nursing. Basically, common sense should prevail, and no one should jeopardise their health to fast.

But what does abstinence mean? Well, if the animal has legs and can walk, that's the sort of meat we are abstaining from.

Now maybe we can remember a time when all Catholics didn't eat meat on Friday's. Is that still something we should be doing? Well, yes and no. Sometime ago, the Australia Bishops did give the option to choose another Friday penance other than abstinence from meat. So, we are certainly still required to do some Friday penance, and abstinence from meat is still a very good option but Catholics may chose some other penance. Examples of this might be reading the Bible; or making the Stations of the Cross; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; or paying a visit to someone who is poor, sick, or lonely.

So, this Lent let's not fast with gloomy faces but with hearts set on fire for love of the Lord!
