REFLECTION

Seeing a young man with no sight caused Jesus' disciples to wonder aloud the cause. Why, Lord? They were curious. They assumed that his blindness was a result of sin, but since he was young, they wondered if it might have been his parents' sin that caused it, not his. So they asked their rabbi, Jesus. His disciples asked him, 'Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?' 'Neither this man nor his parents sinned,' said Jesus, 'but this happened so that the work of God might be displayed in his life.'" (9:2-3) Jesus' answer makes it clear that in this case his affliction wasn't because of someone's sin, but because God had a larger purpose in it, that "the work of God might be displayed in his life" (9:3).

COME & JOIN & BUILD COMMUNITY!

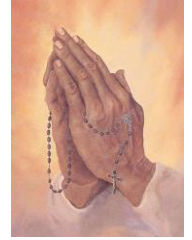

Alms giving

At the start of Lent we heard that Jesus was tempted by the Devil, and the final temptation was this: Our Lord was shown all the Kingdoms of the World, and if he would but bow down and worship the devil, they could be his, all without the pain of the cross. It was the temptation to place the goods of the world above the Good of God. Such a temptation once led Adam and Eve to choose the fruit of the tree over God. But our Lord refused, and he showed us that happiness is not actually the devils to give. That only God can give us happiness and it comes through worshipping him and not chasing worldly possessions and glory. And so, in Lent we are urged to give alms, to practice a spirit of detachment by giving to those in need.

But why must we help the needy? Well, when the Gospel speaks of giving alms, the Greek word literally means, “doing mercy.” It means to be moved with sorrow at the misery of others, as if it were our own misery. And when we are merciful, we are like the Father, because he is moved by our need, he doesn’t just ignore it or think of something else. So, when we give alms, we are drawn into the very life of the Father. Giving to the poor is a medicine that heals the wounds of our soul and makes us like God.

But what if we’re not able to give much? What if we’re struggling with the cost of living too? Well, we can’t help everyone, and our first obligation is always to our family. But still, we must acknowledge that some of what we consider a “need” is not really that. Many “needs” more truly reflect our attachment to worldly desires and the security we seek in them, than any true need of the body.

So, this Lent let’s really consider what we can do for the least in our community. If we don’t know let’s pray about it, and let’s ask how we can help feed the hungry, give the thirsty a drink, cloth the naked, welcome the stranger, and visit the sick and imprisoned. And let’s see in the face of our suffering brothers the suffering face of Christ.
