REFLECTION

The raising of Lazarus shows the fullness of who Jesus is in his humanity and in his divinity. He shows deep compassion for Mary and Martha over the loss of their brother. This grief touches his own heart and he weeps openly. He wants to do something. His prayer to his Father precedes the resuscitation of Lazarus. And when Lazarus comes out from the tomb, Jesus commands those around to unbind him and set him free. He wanted for Lazarus what he wants for us - to have life and live it to the fullest. Today’s gospel points to the resurrection of Jesus but also points to us, showing us the power of Jesus to bring life out of death.

-The Curate's Corner-

As we near the end of Lent I'd like to explain a little of the three Easter liturgies we're anticipating: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. Hopefully if we understand a bit more of what's going on, we'll be able to love and enter more deeply into these great mysteries.

-Holy Thursday-

The Roman Missal (that's the red book the priest prays from at Mass) reminds us that Holy Thursday is truly a celebration of the Eucharist and the priesthood. It's celebrating the night when Christ took the bread and wine and said, "this is my body" and "this is my blood;" words which gained their full meaning the next day when he offered his body and blood on the cross. And when he said, "do this in memory of me," he was speaking to his priests, his apostles, because without the institution of the sacred priesthood, the Eucharist would not be possible. And this is what we celebrate on Holy Thursday, that after they are consecrated at Mass at the hands of the priest, ordinary bread and wine become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus.

So, that's why we celebrate our priests on Holy Thursday because they give us Jesus in the Eucharist, and yet we priests are neither super-human nor inhuman. We are simply human. We laugh, we cry, we get angry, and we can be hurt. We can be stubborn, we can be humble, we can be loving, and we can be hateful. We can be all of the things everyone else can be, but we also have to be something that not everyone can be. We have to be another Christ. So, let's pray for our priests, and let's try to get to mass on Holy Thursday as a sign of our love for the Eucharist and the priesthood. Perhaps we can also make our own this old prayer for priests:

To live in the midst of the world without wishing its pleasures;

To be a member of each family,

Yet belonging to none;

To share all suffering;

To penetrate all secrets;

To heal all wounds;

To go from men to God and offer Him their prayers;

To return from God to men to bring pardon and hope;

To have a heart of fire for Charity,

And a heart of bronze for Chastity;

To teach and to pardon,

Console and bless always.

My God, what a life; and it is yours,

O priest of Jesus Christ.
