REFLECTION:

The story of Thomas illustrates our Christian experience today: We are called to believe without seeing. In fact, all Christians after the first witnesses have been called to believe without seeing. Thomas's doubt is hardly surprising; the news of Jesus' appearance was incredible to the disciples who had seen him crucified and buried. Thomas's human nature compelled him to want hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death was indeed the same Jesus who had been crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to act on that desire. He is our witness that Jesus is really risen.


NOTICES

REFLECTION

We can thank the Apostles and especially Thomas, the last to give in, that our faith in the resurrection and divine glorification of Christ is that much the stronger. Our Christianity which would have ended before the first Easter week had passed, if Christ had not risen in glory, spread rapidly to the then known world and is still spreading because its author was none other than Christ "our Lord and our God." How prophetic were the words of the Gamaliel at the meeting of the Sanhedrin which tried to prevent the Apostles from preaching the new Christian faith: "if this plan or work is of men, it will overthrown; but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow it"

~Easter House Blessings~

As Catholics we bless all sorts of things: our food, our cars, and our workplaces; but one of the most important things to bless are our homes. And we do this because it's a way of putting our life into the hands of the Lord. When we bless our home it's a reminder that Jesus came to live among us, and that we want him to find a home in our home.

So, for the next few Sundays I will leave a sign up sheet at the back of the Church for you to leave your details so I can get in touch and organise a house blessing over the coming months.

~ The Curate's Corner ~

"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ." (1 Cor 15:14-15)

With these words St Paul explains what faith in the resurrection of Jesus Christ means for the Christian faith. It either stands or falls with the truth of the testimony that Christ is risen from the dead. And we can't be Christians if we don't believe this ourselves. Because if Jesus was not raised from the dead, although his ideas might be interesting, he would not be God, and would be no more than a failure. It's the Resurrection that decides whether Jesus merely was or whether he still is. So, given the importance of the Resurrection, I would like to take the next few weeks to explore what it means, and what reasons we have for believing it.

What actually happened?

It's clear from those who met the risen Lord, it's not easy to say. They were confronted with something entirely new, and even before the Resurrection the disciples were struggling to figure out what Jesus meant when he said he would rise from the dead. It's only something they could know by encountering the risen Jesus.

Still the first thing we can say is that the Resurrection is not simply the miracle of bringing a corpse back to life again. Yes, Jesus had done this to Lazarus and multiple others, but if that's all the Resurrection is, it didn't change anything for the apostles or for us. If it's just returning to what life was like before, even doctors today can do this to a person once considered clinically dead.

But the New Testament leaves us in no doubt that what happened in the Resurrection of Jesus was completely different. His Resurrection is about an entirely new form of life, a life that is no longer affected by death and change. Jesus has not returned to his normal human life in this world like Lazarus, but has entered into a new life, the life of God himself.

The apostles can't deny that it's him: they can touch him, they eat and drink with him, he's physically there. But they also can't deny that he's not just resuscitated, that there's something new about him, something that no longer belongs to our world. So, what we can say with absolute certainty is that the Resurrected Jesus goes way beyond all normal human experience and yet he is absolutely real and present.
