REFLECTION:

The readings for the 3rd Sunday in Easter Year A, encourage us to truly walk the path of discipleship. In the first reading Peter boldly proclaims the Good News. The psalm reminds us that God will guide us along the path of life. The second reading explains that Jesus Christ died so we could have new life. And in the gospel, two disciples encounter the risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus. This reading helps us understand the importance of recognizing Jesus in our daily lives and walking with Him as our Saviour and friend.. Christians are called to be witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus, and to share their testimony of how their lives have been changed by their faith in him. This theme is reflected in the reading from Acts, in which Peter proclaims the good news of Jesus' resurrection to a crowd in Jerusalem.



The Resurrection

Last week we said that the Risen Lord goes way beyond all normal human experience and yet he is absolutely real and present. This week then, we shall begin to look at what the accounts of his Resurrection tell us.

Jesus' death - All the accounts of the Resurrection agree that Jesus died and was buried. St Luke notes that Joseph of Arimathea asked for the body and provided the tomb, and St John says that Nicodemus did the embalming. They make it clear that Jesus really was dead, that he fully participated in the human destiny of death, and they knew where his tomb was. That's why the discovery of the empty tomb is so important.

The empty tomb - King David had foretold that God "would not let his Holy One see corruption." (Ps 16:10-11) But as St Peter says, "David both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us today." (Acts 2:29) So if David was still dead, the empty tomb had to be a confirmation that Jesus was this Holy One who didn't see corruption. That he didn't remain in death or decompose but that he conquered death with his death.

The Third Day - We also hear that the empty tomb was discovered on the third day (according to the Jewish measure of time, this was the Sunday after the Friday of Jesus' death). And from the earliest days of the Christian community this was when the faithful would gather for Mass, when they would assemble for worship. But knowing how important the Sabbath was in the Old Testament (the Jewish Sabbath is always on Saturday), that keeping it was literally one of the commandments, what led the first Christians to abandon it in favour of Sunday worship? Well, it can only have been an event as profound as the Resurrection.

Who saw the Risen Lord? - The New Testament specifically says that on Easter Sunday Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene, the women that came to Jesus' tomb (Mary the Mother of James, Salome, and Joanna), Peter, and two disciples on the Emmaus road. After this he also appeared to the remainder of the twelve disciples with Thomas absent. Later he appeared to them with Thomas present. There was also an appearance to seven disciples on the Sea of Galilee. On another occasion he appeared to over five hundred people at the same time. There is also an appearance to James the Apostles. And finally, to his disciples as he ascended into heaven.
