ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34,37-43

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1-4

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: John 20:1-9

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

~ The Curate's Corner ~

Congratulations we've finished lent! Maybe we stumbled our way through it or maybe it was a time of spiritual growth, whatever the case may be, this week was our Lord's turn. And so we celebrate that after his death he rose again. All of this is wonderfully expressed in what the Church calls "the night of nights." The Easter Vigil is filled with some of the Church's most ancient rituals, and so to help us understand them here is a short

explanation along with a commentary from Pope Benedict XVI.

The Liturgy of Light (Lucernarium)

We begin this night shrouded in darkness as a fire is lit outside the church and the Paschal candle is lit from it. The darkness is a reminder of the spiritual state of the world, but the candle represents Jesus Christ, the light of the world. The priest processes into the dark church proclaiming, "The light of Christ!" By the time he reaches the sanctuary the entire church is blazing with candles lit from the Paschal candle. "As the procession makes its way through the church, shrouded in the darkness of the night, the light of the Paschal Candle becomes a wave of lights, and it speaks to us of Christ as the true morning star that never sets – the Risen Lord in whom light has conquered darkness."

The Easter Proclamation (Exsultet)

When the Paschal candle arrives in the sanctuary, the priest chants the "Easter Proclamation." Also called the *Exsultet*, from its first word in Latin, "Exult", this ancient hymn speaks of mysteries of this night.

"This hymn reminds us that the candle has its origin in the work of bees. So, the whole of creation plays its part. But also the candle contains a silent reference to the Church. The cooperation of the living community of believers in the Church in some way resembles the activity of bees. It builds up the community of light. So, the candle serves as a summons to us to become involved in the community of the Church, whose purpose is to let the light of Christ shine upon the world."

The Baptismal Liturgy

Even if there are no baptisms the water of the baptismal font is blessed, and everyone present renews their own baptismal vows. If the whole of Lent was a journey through the desert, the renewal of our baptismal promises is a crossing over of the Jordan in the promised land of life in Christ.

"Baptism is more than a bath, a purification. It is more than becoming part of a community. It is a new birth. A new beginning in life. In Baptism we give ourselves over to Christ – he takes us unto himself, so that we no longer live for ourselves, but through him, with him and in him; so that we live with him and thus for others."
