COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

If you love me, keep my commandments, says the Lord, and I will ask the Father and he will send you another Paraclete, to abide with you for ever, alleluia.

<u>REFLECTION</u>: Having experienced the pain and sorrow of the crucifixion, then the joy and new life of the resurrection, Jesus' followers now have to face the reality of the Risen Lord's departure. He senses their confusion, pain and sense of loss. But before he leaves them, He prepares them for the road ahead and gives them two parting gifts; The Holy Spirit and his own Peace. He strengthens and encourages them with His risen life through these gifts. He is sending them out to proclaim the good news, but does not expect them to do it alone. Encouraged by His presence, they will never be alone or helpless, and neither are we. We are asked to face our daily reality and lives not just with optimism but with faith and hope in the risen Jesus. As we continue with our own journeys, may we too be blessed with the gifts of Christ's Peace and encouraged by the power of the Holy Spirit.



~ The Curate's Corner ~

Last Sunday we heard the Apostles say in the Book of Acts, "It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; we need to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word." And the point is not that giving out food is beneath them, like someone less important should do that, but that eternal salvation is more important than any physical need we could ever have. Yes, the poor need bread, but they need even more to be spiritually fed. And this why the Church exists, to help all people come to know, love and serve the Lord. Because what we need most is not comfort and good working conditions, but to know that our life has a purpose. That our anxiety and fears don't come from having too little but loving and being loved too little.

The Clergy

Now to carry out this mission Christ instituted the hierarchy of the Church. He called Peter the rock upon which His Church is built, and after the Ascension, Peter became his physical representation on Earth. And under Peter, the apostles were also given the task of continuing his mission. Jesus knew that we are like sheep, needing to be feed, needing to be guided and protected from harm, so he gave us shepherds.

But what does the appointment of the first pope and bishops have to do with us today? Well from the very beginning, Jesus established a line of succession in our leadership so we can trust that it remains faithful to the mission of the Church. Each of our bishops and popes can be traced back, one by one, in a direct line of succession all the way to Peter and the apostles. And as successors of the apostles, bishops receive from the Lord the mission to teach all nations and to preach the gospel to everyone, so that all may gain salvation through faith. baptism and the keeping of the commandments.

And under our bishops are priests. These men serve as our particular leaders in our particular communities. Their job is to continue the mission of the Church by ministering to people on a much more personal and direct level. Priests are called to be obedient to the pope and their bishop and like spiritual fathers, they are to look after the faithful whom they have spiritually brought to birth by baptism and by their teaching. So next week we shall see the particular ways that Bishops and Priests act as shepherds.
