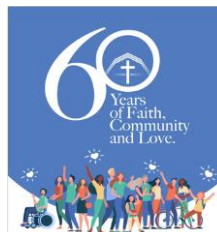

## **Divorced? Where do I stand now?**

**Q: I am recently divorced. Can I still receive Communion?**

A: In short, yes. It is important to understand that divorce itself is not the sin, as many assume. You are still able to receive communion. You are not to receive communion if you re-marry without an annulment. That is why we invite you to come and see us.

**Q: I already have a civil divorce so why do I need an annulment? What is the difference?**

A: According to Canon Law Canon 1061 §1 states, marriage possesses the favor of law; therefore, in a case of doubt, the validity of a marriage must be upheld until the contrary is proven. A divorce decree is a civil document that is not affiliated with the Church. A civil divorce does not signify the end of a sacramental marriage and put simply, it is a civil law document that states you are free to marry only according to civil law, while the Church believes your marriage is permanent until the contrary is proven. The Tribunal assesses the validity of your marriage according to Civil Law through the process of an annulment, and if successful, you are declared 'free to marry' again in the Catholic Church.

**Q: I want to get an annulment but don't agree to involving my ex-partner. Will the annulment proceed without contacting him or her?**

A: Whilst we appreciate that most divorce cases involve a great deal of pain and conflict, we have an obligation under Canon Law to inform the other party that an application for nullity has been requested. We ask you to provide us with an address or contact details. In many cases, Respondents choose not to participate. You will not be required to have any contact with the Respondent during the process.

**Q: I am getting married in 3 months time. Will my annulment be processed by then?**

A: An annulment is not guaranteed and so to avoid disappointment and other losses, no wedding arrangements can take place until a decision is made. On average, each case takes between 6-8 months to complete, depending on the complexity of the case and the willingness of witnesses and parties to cooperate.

**Q: Okay, I think I want to go ahead and start an application. Who do I speak to?**

### *~ The Curate's Corner ~*

So we know that the Eucharist is the most important thing in life, that there is no greater gift in all creation than the body and blood of Christ. And, yet have you noticed that the final words at mass are "Go forth!" Yes, we are called to receive Jesus Christ at the hands of the priest but then we are called to take what we have received out into the world. And here we see the relationship between the clergy and the laity. Those who are set apart in sacred ministry aren't superior to everyone else and their life is not a reproach to those living in the world. It's true they turn their backs on the world, but they don't turn their backs on those called by God to remain in the world. Rather, priests are set apart precisely so they can minister to Christ's lay faithful, those who face the heat of battle on the front lines.

### *Christ's lay faithful*

Venerable Fulton Sheen once said, "The laity will have to come to a comprehension that our blessed Lord was not crucified in a cathedral between two candles but in the world, on a roadway, in a town garbage heap, at the crossroads where there were three languages written upon the Cross. Yes, they were Hebrew, Latin and Greek, but they could just as well have been English, Bantu or African. It would make no difference. He placed Himself at the very centre of the world, in the midst of dust, thieves, soldiers and gamblers. He was there to extend pardon to them. This is the vocation of the laity: to go out into the world and make Christ known."

So, the job of lay people isn't to imitate the priest or even duplicate his efforts. They are to bring Christ to the world they live in, socialise in and work in. Every Christian is called to offer sacrifice, and for the lay person their altar of sacrifice is the work bench and the parch bench and the kitchen table. The lay person is called to bring Christ into places that a priest could never reach, they are called to reach into hearts in a way that only a mother or father, or brother or sister can. And so next week we'll look at the ways that lay people can bring Christ into their daily life and do God's work in the world.
