REFLECTION: Jesus wanted his disciples to see their lives from the perspective of God, that we are made for everlasting life, that we are meant for eternity. To not be afraid of physical death, but rather be afraid of spiritual death, of breaking our relationship with God. In the Gospel, he talks about the Fatherhood of God and his providence and care for us. He wanted to make sure that our fear of God is not out of a bad image that sees God as a tyrant. It should be as in the context of the Scriptures: a deep respect, reverence and awe of his holiness and greatness. In the Old Testament, we know that the “fear of God is the beginning of wisdom.” Why do we need to trust God and seek his will and follow it? Simply because he loves us and he knows what is best for us. What Jesus is ultimately teaching in this Gospel is that God is all-powerful and all-knowing and there is no reason to fear death as God has come to the world to save us so that we can live with him forever.

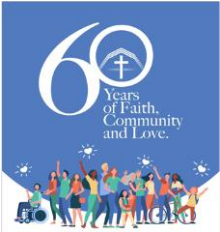

~ The Curate's Corner ~

A theology of the Home

The whole Christian story can be summed up in the idea of a Father welcoming his children home. Just think, it was through their disobedience that Adam and Eve, ran away from the Father's house and closed the door the heaven. Then the Jews prayed that a messiah could come and open that door up again. And this prayer was answered in the birth, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ. He's the one who opens the door to the Father's house. And as he says in in the book of Revelations, "Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in and eat with you, and you with me." That's the reason Jesus came, he wants to bring us back home.

So, it's not much of a stretch to say that the front doors of our homes, should be like a kind of door to heaven. By the peace and love that people find in our homes, by the refuge and the rest, people should get a sense of what it's like to return to the Father's home, what it's like to be forgiven, to be loved, to be worthy of sacrifice. So now we might look at some practical ways that our home can become a fitting home for Him who loves us above all.

Practical tips

It is customary that Catholics have their houses blessed around the time of the Epiphany or Easter. But really a house can be blessed at any time, just ask your priest and book in a time. And the idea is that we consecrate our homes or offer them up to God so that they may become a place where He is known and loved.

Another type of blessing is called the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This blessing, a part of the devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, involves placing an image of Jesus at the centre of your home and having a priest lead a prayer service which dedicates the house to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Again, the idea is that Jesus is at the centre of our family life, and he too participates in all our family activities.

Another way to sanctify our homes is by having a holy water font just inside the front door. Much like at Church, it's an ancient practice to bless ourselves as we enter our homes, and so recall our baptism and the fact that we are Christians. Also, it's a reminder that what happens in our home is a bit part of what happens in our souls.
