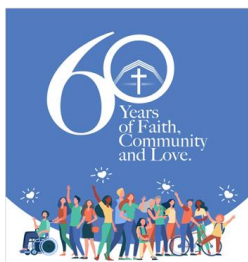

Farewell to Sister Jimsy

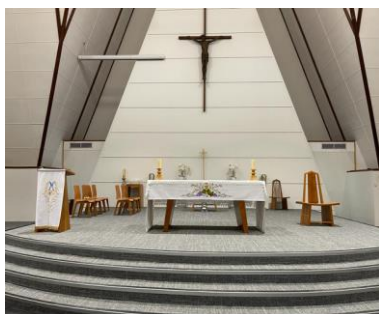

~ The Curate's Corner ~

A theology of the Home

One of the deepest truths about us is that we are a composition of both body and soul. To put it simply, I'm more than just my body, but I also can't be me without my body. And this means that while our spirits soar to the heavens, our bodies want to be there too. And the way we experience our faith, our relationship with God, is not just in our mind, but in the things and places around us.

Take for example the growth of a child. What a wonderful thing to think about, to think of a child growing more and more into who they are called to be. But have you ever seen a wall, or a door frame marked with the progressing heights of children? Maybe you had this in your own home, children certainly love it, but it's a physical way of getting more deeply into the spiritual experience of growth. Well things like this happen all the time in our homes. You know cooking is not about the food, but about what happens at the table, just like making our home isn't about the house but what happens in that house. Our efforts are not for the structure and the things themselves; they are for the people and enduring connections established in this place.

And this is why as Catholics we understand that both the material and the spiritual are important. Both work together for the sake of true human flourishing. Families who are conscious of this tend to prize ceremonies, traditions, and things handed down that point to family and togetherness. Meaning is given to things that evoke our connection to the past, and all this ultimately rests on our desire for communion and for eternity.

So how can we promote spiritual flourishing through our everyday experience of the home?

Practical tips

Well, one way is to incorporate spiritually significant events into our calendar of celebrations. Maybe on the anniversary of our baptism we can cook special meals or ask our children what their favourite thing to eat would be. Maybe we can have not just a Christmas tree but an Advent wreath too. Perhaps during the month of May we can put a picture of Mary in a prominent place. Maybe during the month of November when we pray for the souls of the deceased, we can gather the family around photos of our loved ones and pray especially for their eternal rest. Really, we can be creative here, there are so many ways to remember and pass down values through the way we live in our homes.
