### REFLECTION:

Jesus Christ was the embodiment of compassion, forgiveness, and human dignity in his time on earth as a human being. And now we collectively are to be the embodiment of compassion, justice, forgiveness, and human dignity in our world. Thus, essentially, we become the Holy Body of Christ. Just as Jesus was glorified in resurrection, you who are part of his Body through Holy Communion also are to be glorified after your earthly pilgrimage. The Holy Communion with the Body of Christ defines your religious identity so much that the Church’s discipline requires Catholics to participate in Mass every weekend. Also, all other six sacraments are directed towards the Eucharist which constitutes the Church. Since it was God’s will that humans should share in his divinity, let there be praise and glory to the most holy Sacrament of the Altar.

This is a 12 month programme beginning in Term 3, Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> July 2023. It is open to children in year 3 at school or older.

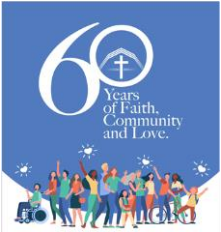

## *~ The Curate's Corner ~*

### *A theology of the Home*

Home...just think about it for a moment. Home... just reading this word probably brings up a whole heap of different memories and emotions. Hopefully many good, but maybe also some sad. Whatever the case, there's no debate that our homes are where we are meant to be safe, nurtured, known for who we are, and are able to live and love freely. And even for those from broken homes or homes that no longer exist, there is still something about the idea of home that pulls at us.

But why is the home a place that so captures our minds and spirits? Well, it's because so much happens between these four walls. G.K Chesterton once wrote, "The place where babies are born, where men die, where the drama of mortal life is acted, is not an office or a shop. It is something much smaller in size and much larger in scope. And while nobody would be such a fool as to pretend that it is the only place where people should work, or even the only place where women should work, it has a character of unity and universality that is not found in any of the fragmentary experiences of the division of labour." His point is that our homes may be small, but they leave an enormous mark on our lives. Our homes satisfy our bodily needs, but they are also a window into heaven.

Cleaning the floors, making a bed, watering a plant, cleaning up after a child, cutting potatoes, saying prayers, arguing and making up. All these things, seen and unseen, are a part of God's plan for our life. They are not just things that need to be done before we're ready to worship God. How we live daily, with all its struggles and imperfections, joys and laughter, it's all a part of how we live our faith. So, for the next few months I would like to present something of a theology of the home. The goal is not to write a bunch of nice sounding but mostly useless words, but rather to help you find the eternal in the everyday. Each week we will go through a simple guide on how to make our homes better equipped to get all those living in them to the Father's house. Whether you live alone, or with a crowd, in a big house or a small one, there are many ways to make your home a place of love, safety, freedom, creativity, and most importantly a place where faith can grow.
