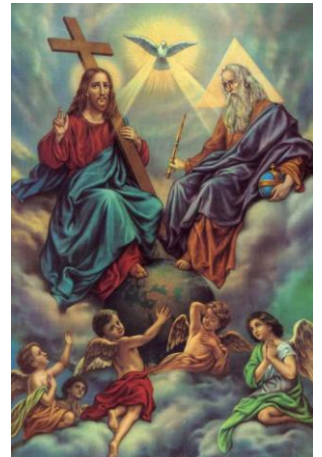

REFLECTION: Trinity Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate the unity of God whom we acknowledge as Father, Son and Spirit. Today’s gospel reminds us that there is a seamless continuity between the different experiences of God. Although we sometimes regard the God of the Old Testament as judging and vengeful, today reminds us that God is, was, and always will be a God of love. The gospel reminds us that ‘God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son.’ Love is the characteristic of God that is experienced as Father, Son and Spirit. God loved the world into being and loved the people so much that God made a covenant relationship with them and repeatedly drew them back into that relationship when they strayed. God loved the world and the people so much that God became physically present through Jesus as yet another attempt to draw all people into an awareness of the loving relationship God desired for them. When Jesus could no longer remain a physical presence in the world, God’s Spirit became more evident to continue the work of drawing people into that loving relationship with God.

Hectorville Catholic Parish Sacramental Programme 2023-2024

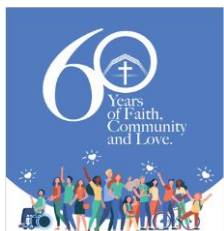
This is a 12 month programme and is open to children in year 3 at school or older. The programme begins in Term 3, on Sunday 30th July 2023.

~ The Curate's Corner ~

So, the laity are called to bring Christ into whatever they are doing, but how do they do that? Well, it takes just the same kind of holiness that a priest is called to. Yes, there is a big difference in the way that lay people are called to be holy, but they still are called to incorporate in their lives the ideals of poverty, chastity, and obedience, that Christ gave to his followers. So, what would this look like?

Poverty

Though a lay person is not called to the same sort of radical poverty as a monk, they are very much supposed to practice a real detachment from the goods of the world. Unless we have interior freedom from an addiction to wealth, power, pleasure, rank, or honour we cannot follow the will of God as we ought. It's only when we liberate ourselves from these powerful forces that we are ready to become the saint God wants us to be. So, poverty, in the sense of detachment, is essential to the holiness of the laity.

Chastity

Chastity is also crucial to lay spirituality. To be sure, the way that clergy and religious practice chastity—namely, as celibates—is unique to them, but the virtue itself is just as applicable to the laity. Chastity simply means a rightly ordered sexuality. And this means bringing our sexual life into what it means more broadly to love. That love is not a feeling, but rather willing the good of the other. And this is why the Church teaches that sex belongs within the context of marriage, and that things like contraception and pornography are not only sinful but deeply damaging to relationships. We know just how much a disordered sexuality can destabilise a person, let alone those around them, and this is why God's plan for marriage and sexuality are so important. They really do help us to love.

Obedience

Finally, the laity are meant to practice obedience, again not in the same way as religious, but in a manner proper to the lay state. There must be a willingness to follow, not the voice of one's own ego, but the voice of God. We might say that the point of the spiritual life is to break free of the desire to do whatever we want, so that we can embrace God's plan for us; a plan that is infinitely better and brings more happiness. Most of us, most of the time, are preoccupied with our own wealth, success, career plans, and personal pleasure. But to obey God is to break out of these soul-killing preoccupations and hear the voice of the Shepherd.
