Recently, at the invitation of James Stevens our local Federal MP for Sturt, we were successful in our application to secure funds under the Stronger Communities Programme (SCP). This was an

opportunity for James to work with our community and to contribute to our long term vibrancy and viability. Under the SCP grant we were able to secure 50% of the cost of the supply and install of the Church projector which enabled us to replace the ageing and no longer serviceable older unit. ~ The Curate's Corner ~ A theology of the Home

We've spent the last few weeks exploring the idea that our homes are where we prepare for our heavenly home. And so, for the next part of our study, I want to look at some of the ways they do this. The first is they marvellously capture the play of light and darkness.

There's something special about throwing the curtains open on a bright morning. As the light floods in you're reminded that you're alive and that it's good to be alive. And many of our happiest moments occur against the backdrop of a bright sunny day. Still each day comes to an end, the sun goes back home, and we're left with darkness inside the walls of our house. But for many this new part of the day can seem like it's not much different from what came before; bright lights are flicked on and we simply keeping going: maybe it's making sandwiches for tomorrow's lunch, or just gathering around the glow of the TV. Yet for nearly all human history, the coming of evening was a dramatic reminder that we are surrounded by darkness. Without the glow of light made possible by electricity, people's worlds were plunged into darkness and the home became the one place where light survived. And this is why Christ describes himself as, "the light of the world," and light is a symbol of his presence. Just think of the advent wreath and the paschal candle. Christ casts out the darkness, he's the one who conquers sin and evil. And "all the darkness in the world cannot extinguish the light of a single candle."

In our lives, we will have periods flooded with light, moments that feel like the bursting forth of light into a dark room. Maybe it's the discovery of love, or finding of one's vocation, or a moment of healing. At times the love of Christ quite literally overwhelms us. But still there are times of darkness, times when it seems like no light can make it through, but in these moments, we can trust that Christ is our light. That if we have him, no amount of darkness can ever overcome us. Love by nature is meant to be shared. Like a light in the darkness, it isn't contained but rather spreads and calls others towards it. Our homes can reflect this.

Practical tips

Make candlelight a feature of your home! Maybe the next family rosary can be prayed by candlelight. This will create a tight night circle, and what draws us first closer physically will eventually makes us emotionally and spiritual closer. Or how about we find our baptismal candle and light that on the anniversary of our baptism.
