REFLECTION: This week’s readings highlight how our relationship with God helps us grow, which in turn allows our lives to bear fruit. The first reading explains that God’s Word is like the rain, which falls on the earth and makes it fertile. The second reading reminds us that a new creation is going to emerge. And in the gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the sower and explains that our hearts must be ready to receive the Word of God. The sower who scattered seeds symbolizes the spreading of God’s word. The seeds fell on different types of soil, representing various responses to the message. Some seeds produced abundant fruit, while others were hindered by thorns, rocky ground, or birds. For us, it represents the various responses to the word of God, including unbelief, superficial faith, distractions, and genuine faith and fruitfulness.

Dear Parishioners, Recently, at the invitation of James Stevens our local Federal MP for Sturt, we were successful in our application to secure funds under the Stronger Communities Programme (SCP). Dear Volunteers, it is an instruction by the Child Protection Unit that it is now a requirement of all volunteers (whether you are directly dealing with children or not) to read, sign and return the Code of Conduct document to the Parish office. Please email admin@hectorvilleparish.com.au for a copy of the Code of Conduct or pick one up from the Parish office.

90-minute Briefing for Volunteers – Mandatory Notification

All volunteers in our Archdiocese are mandated notifiers under the South Australian Child Protection Legislation. **All parish volunteers, including: Parish Council Members, Finance Council Members, Sacramental program Coordinators, Choir Members, cleaners, counting team, readers, commentators, Children's liturgy team and St. Vincent De Paul members.** Regardless if you are directly dealing with children or not, must undertake this 90-minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit, if you didn't participate in the briefing session earlier this year. A Volunteer Briefing session will be held at the: **Annunciation Church on Tuesday August 15th at 7.00pm – 8.30pm:**

A theology of the Home

It used to be the case that families farmed together, sung and played musical instruments together and stitched quilts and talked on the porch together. Really there was no shortage of family time. But that's not the case anymore. Now dinner is really the only time that families get to connect and find out what's going on with each other. It's hard to find a more constant backdrop to home life than food. And so, this week we'll focus on the importance of nourishment.

Much of modern life encourages us to do away with the traditional family meal. Whether it's protein bars, uber eats or just long hours at work, many things make the family meal an option that just seems too hard. But let's think about what we might be missing out on.

It's true that we share our hunger with animals, they need to eat just like we do. But eating also highlights the very thing that makes us distinct as humans, our use of reason and our spirit. As spiritual beings we find a meaning in this act which would otherwise be dull and boring. Yes, we feed ourselves and others, but we're also feeding and nourishing our relationships through the daily duties of dishes, crumb covered floors, hungry teenagers fetching water for a smaller child, attempts at civilised conversation, and shrieks of laughter at something someone has said. There are so many moments where being gathered around the table is an opportunity to grow in knowing and loving those around us.

But that's not all. Think about the sacrifice and care that goes into preparing a meal for others. First there's the work that pays for the grocery bill, then there's the shopping, then the preparation. Really there are few ways better of expressing your love than preparing a meal for someone. Or even think about how the patterns of our eating prepare us for worship. Whether it's fasting on Good Friday, or feasting on Easter Sunday, the rhythm of our homelife really does prepare us for heaven.

Practical tips

Honour the Lord's Day! On Sunday all work should cease, and families should come together to rest and to worship. So, after Sunday mass have a family lunch. This is the best of Catholic culture – family, hospitality, prayer, food, wine, gratitude communion, and rest. And maybe invite someone who doesn't have a family to eat with. It might just be that they leave feeling restored, and with a better sense of who they are in the eyes of the Lord.
