**GOSPEL**: Matthew 13:24-43

#### **COMMUNION ANTIPHON:**

The Lord, the gracious, the merciful, has made a memorial of his wonders; he gives food to those who fear him.

**REFLECTION**: In today's gospel Jesus tells a parable about a farmer who sowed good seeds in his field, but an enemy also sowed weeds among them. When the weeds grew, the farmer chose to let them coexist with the wheat until the harvest. Jesus explains that the wheat represents the righteous, while the weeds symbolise the wicked, and they will be separated in the end. This represents the reality that in this world, both believers and non-unbelievers will coexist until the final judgment, highlighting the presence of evil and the challenges faced by believers in a fallen world. Jesus also teaches us that the kingdom of God will expand and grow, starting small but eventually encompassing many people, cultures, and nations, reflecting God's plan for the expansion of His kingdom.

#### <u>90-minute Briefing for Volunteers –</u> Mandatory Notification

All volunteers in our Archdiocese are mandated notifiers under the South Australian Child Protection Legislation. All parish volunteers, including: Parish Council Members, Finance Council Members, **Sacramental** program Coordinators, Choir Members, cleaners, counting team. readers. commentators. Children's liturgy team and St. Vincent De Paul members. Regardless if you are directly dealing with children or not, must undertake this 90minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit, if you didn't participate in the briefing session earlier this year. #### ~ The Curate's Corner ~ A theology of the Home

We have a lot of bush fires in Australia, it's just been that way for all our history. With searing heat and lots of flammable vegetation, it's a matter of when rather than if the next bushfire will come. And survivors describe bushfires as truly terrifying experiences - walls of flame meters high, smoke plumes so dense they turn day into night, and a roar so loud it's deafening. Still for most of us, our houses are so comfortable we've lost a sense of how vulnerable we are to the wild. Yes, it might be cold, be we just turn the heater on. Sure, it's really raining outside, but we'll only get a bit wet going from the car to the house.

But our ancestors knew few of these conveniences. At night they only had candles and blankets to give light and warmth, and if you wanted to travel you had to walk. They knew the beauty of the wild but also its dangers. And this awareness really encouraged a deep religious understanding. That's why the scriptures present oceans and deserts as symbolic of the forces that threaten our soul. The wilderness was the home of the devil, and that's why Christ went there for 40 days to battle him. Monks and hermits didn't go to the desert to escape the city, but to do battle with the forces of evil.

So, it's no wonder we build places of refuge. Our home is the place where we don't have to be on our guard, where we felt safe, loved and reassured. It's a place where we can rest and enjoy the fruit of our labours, so that we're ready to go back out into the world. But our homes are not just a place that keep evil out, they are also where we turn to God. The home is where we first learn what it's like to love, to forgive and be forgiven, to give without counting the cost and to really rest. In our homes we can be who we are, there's no more pretending. And this why our homes are a foretaste of what's promised in our heavenly home. Here on earth, we don't ever realise all our desires, there's always something still lacking. It's only in heaven that our hearts have all they long for.

#### Practical tips

Enjoy Saturday afternoons! Saturday mornings are mostly spent taking children to sport or cleaning the house, and these things need to be done. But what if Saturday afternoon was a privileged time when conversation was encouraged, ideas discussed, and people heard. What if we gave ourselves the time to disagree, speak freely and most importantly to love those we live with. So maybe we can each sit in our favourite chair and read a book, or listen to our favourite music together, or cook a meal and talk while doing the dishes and enjoying the smell that wafts through the house.
