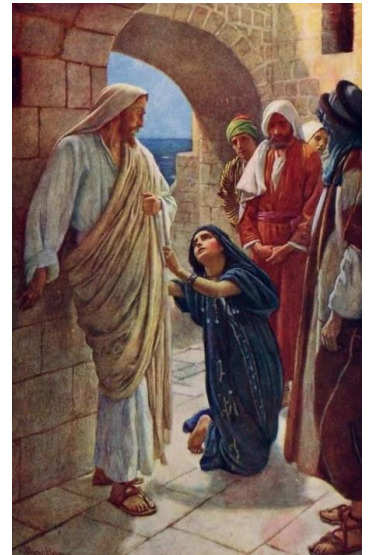

REFLECTION: Today’s reading from the book of Matthew about the Canaanite woman is one of those fascinating stories in which Jesus’ actions could be easily misunderstood. As the story unfolds, Jesus replies to this woman’s desire for help by stating, “It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs.” Ouch! This initially sounds rude, but of course it wasn’t. Jesus’ initial silence toward this woman are actions through which Jesus is able to not only purify this woman’s faith, but also give her the opportunity to manifest her faith for all to see. In the end, Jesus cries out, “O woman, great is your faith!” It’s a story by which we come to understand that great faith comes as a result of purification and unwavering trust. This woman states to Jesus, “Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters.” In other words, she begged for mercy despite her unworthiness. It’s essential to understand that at times God appears to be silent. This is an act of deep love on His part because it is actually an invitation to turn to Him on a very deep level. God’s silence allows us to move from a faith fed by accolades and emotion to a faith fostered by pure trust in His mercy.

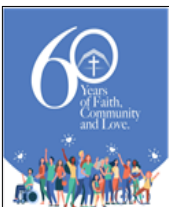

~The Curate's Corner ~ A theology of the Home

Most of us sense that we're made for something more. And it's true, we are made for heaven. But in a world which no longer looks to heaven, very often we're just left with a misguided sense that we're too good for what's ordinary. We should be extraordinary we tell ourselves. But that's not how Christ lived. For nearly all his life he was unknown beyond his village and occupied himself with the duties of daily life. He thought more of what he needed for work the next day than about changing the world. And it's because our daily work is a big part of what makes us holy. It's like St Jose Maria Escriva said, "what use is it telling me that so and so is a good Christian but a bad shoemaker? If he doesn't try and learn his trade well, or doesn't give his full attention to it, he won't be able to sanctify it or offer it to the Lord."

Still our home is not merely a place where we prepare for success in the world; rather our success in the world is for the sake of our home. How many mothers long for the moment their husband walks through the door in the evening. And what he does next goes a long way to completing or depleting the happiness of the family. A heroic husband walks through the door saying, "let's do this," and together with his wife gets the showers going, helps whoever needs help with their homework, and it's not until the dishes are done and children are in bed that both collapse into the lounge chair. And many days they will be too tired to respond with much more than the gratitude contained in a wry smile. But this is a Catholic family, that the crux of both of their days is the family they are raising not the successes or failings one might be having at work.

Sadly, our culture doesn't really see it this way anymore. Both men and women are subtly encouraged to see their family as a burden getting in the way of their higher purpose, and parents their role as little more than providing for their children's material needs. What's more, the role of the mother is often trivialised, and little value is given to the time and sacrifice taken to raise children. So, the often-tedious work of home life feels menial and like something we want to escape from. And it's not long before spouses see each other as competitors rather than allies. But when men and women are united in giving first place to the home, the ordinary is elevated and ennobled and found to be necessary for holiness and happiness.

Practical tips

Privilege home above work! It used to be said that the hand that rocks the cradle is the hand that rules the world, and it's because it's at home we learn religion, it's at home that we learn to love, to sacrifice, to forgive and to suffer well. So, prioritise time spent with your family, even if it means some sacrifice. There will be times when work is busy, but don't forget why we work. Our home is not a place to escape from life, but a place to enter more deeply into it.
