REFLECTION: On the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A, the gospel raises a vital question from Jesus: “But who do you say that I am?” If we were to introduce Jesus to others, could we? How would we define Him? This reflection prompts us to ponder our perception of Jesus and our connection with Him. It encourages us to consider who Jesus is to us personally, urging us to evaluate our relationship with Him. This contemplation emphasizes the significance of understanding and articulating our beliefs about Jesus, ultimately deepening our spiritual connection and enriching our faith journey. The Gospel unveils a pivotal moment where Jesus designates Peter as the cornerstone of His church, granting him authority over heaven’s keys and establishing him as the first pope. This profound passage serves as the bedrock for the “Keys to Leadership” activity, which thoughtfully navigates the parallels between Peter’s role and modern leadership. By engaging in this activity, participants delve into the essence of Peter’s leadership journey, forging connections between scripture and their own experiences, while gaining valuable insights into the principles that underpin effective leadership within faith communities and beyond.

~The Curate's Corner ~

A theology of the Home

When we take our first gasp of air in this world, we take it as one in a family. We are the oldest, the baby, the middle child or the only child. And then as we grow, we are the silly one, the quiet one, the high achiever or the rascal of the family. But at some point, it's time to fly from the nest, to make a life of our own. And when this happens it's the hope of every parent that they've done enough to pass on the faith to their child. That as they are both enthralled and made weary by the world, they will still remember why they're alive and for whom. And that when the time comes to start their own family, it will be a thoroughly Catholic one. Really this is the goal of our homelife, to hand down our faith. That it could be said of us: "We are a Catholic family. We utilise the sacraments whenever possible. We know how to apologise to each other and to God. We celebrate the feasts, pray the rosary, love babies and the less fortunate. We look for the glory of God everywhere and we find it. We use our gifts to serve others, we try to make sacrifices, and we labour to store up treasure in heaven, knowing that only there will our happiness be complete."

But life doesn't frequently turn out like we plan, often we find ourselves in situations we would rather not be in. Maybe we're just married or recently moved to Australia and our home is not as nice as we hoped, maybe we're in our twilight years and must leave home to downsize or move to a nursing home. Such transitions can be disorientating and make us wonder where we belong. But here we must realise that our true home is wherever God's will is. Though we might find ourselves living where we would not choose to be, or longing for a time or place taken from us, the firm belief that we belong to God and with God, frees us to see our circumstances in a new way. Our desire for belonging, for a home, for lasting relationships, it's all an invitation to belong to God, to find a home in him and to build a lasting relation with him.

Practical tips

Send a care package! Many of us know people having to create a home away from home. Maybe it's moving interstate for work, moving into a care facility, or just moving into a rental for a while. In these instances, care packages can help us feel like we're at home, even if that's not quite possible for the moment. So, make some soup, bundle up some of their favourite snacks, buy a bunch of flowers or print off a few photos of moments spent together. These little acts of love can turn a scary and overwhelming time into one that is much more manageable and comfortable.
