GOSPEL: Matthew 16:21-27

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

How great is the goodness, Lord, that you keep for those who fear you.

REFLECTION: Now that the disciples have acknowledged that Jesus is the Messiah, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his ministry: he must suffer and die in Jerusalem to be raised on the third day. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely, calling him "Satan." In opposing this aspect of Jesus' mission, Peter shows that he is no longer speaking based on the revelation from God but as a human being. Jesus then teaches all of the disciples about the difficult path of discipleship: to be Christ's disciple is to follow in his way of the cross. Notice how Jesus reprimands Peter. Do we sometimes forget to let God be God for us? That is, do we sometimes get discouraged because God doesn't act in our world in the ways that we expect? Peter was expecting a Messiah that would carry out a different plan than the one Jesus had explained. Jesus was indeed the Messiah, but his life and death would show a different understanding of what it means to be the Messiah. We too have expectations of God and our own ideas about what we think God ought to be doing in our world. Like Peter we may risk limiting our image of God by thinking only in human ways. God's plan is always more than we can ever imagine.

New Community Centre Design




Code of Conduct

~The Curate's Corner ~ A theology of the Home

The scriptures don't really say much about the home life of the Holy Family. But we can speculate that many of the things they did were humble, mundane, and seemingly insignificant. It's most likely Mary and Jospeh did all the normal household things we do: laundry, dishes, cooking, cleaning, and fixing a few things here and there. But the most important thing for Mary and Joseph was to be present to their son Jesus. He was the centre of their life, and all their work and home life were for him.

Now one of the most moving moments in the scriptures is when our Lord calls out from the cross, "woman behold your son," and to the disciple he says, "behold your mother." It's the moment Mary becomes not only the Lord's mother but our mother too. But as Pope Benedict XVI once pointed out, when it says that St John took Mary to his own home, it means much more than just giving her a place to live. Instead, the original Greek translates literally to, "he took Mary into his inner life", or "he took Mary into the depths of his being." It means that she wasn't just a housemate; no, St John took our Lady into his home and his heart. And this is what home life is all about. Carefully planned rooms and manicured gardens are nice, but our homes don't need to be luxurious or even physically beautiful to be perfect. Rather a home is perfect when it is a place where Christ is known and loved. Desiring a home that makes us feel comfortable and safe is a good thing, but as St Paul reminds us, "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all." Our hope does not rest in the comforts and consolations of this world. it resides in Christ, the one who opens the gates of Heaven and brings us home. So, at home let's raise our eyes to Heaven, and do everything to prepare for that place "no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him."

Practical tips

Let's make our homes a place where our Lord and his holy family are literally found! Let's have holy images and statues, so that visitors, and more importantly our children, are not left guessing if we're Catholic or not. But Christ's birth was also the first step in clearing out the idols and pagan gods that had crept into the world. So, a Catholic home should not have any non-Christian religious symbols, statues or artifacts. If we didn't know this that's ok, but now we do, so believing in the living God means no buddas, dream catchers, healing crystals or anything else like that. Let's only have things that lead to Christ.
