Like the deer that yearns for running streams, so my soul is yearning for you, my God; my soul is thirsting for God, the living God.



**REFLECTION**: It takes much humility and a pure heart to confront another person with their sin in such a way that they listen and repent and equally it takes humility when another confronts us with our own sin. The number one enemy of reconciliation is pride. Pride is a habit by which we think about ourselves first and foremost and makes self-evaluation impossible. We become blind to our sin and are agitated the moment it is identified. The opposite of pride is humility. This is the virtue that enables us to forget about ourselves and have concern only for others. When a person grows in humility, the evil one will always tempt them with thoughts such as: What about you? You are right and they are wrong! This is unfair! These tempting thoughts must always be rejected. Humility only makes sense when we are humble. To the person who has pride, humility will seem foolish. But humility is true wisdom. Reflect, today, upon how humble you are when someone expresses concern to you about your sin. How do you react? If you find yourself getting angry and defensive, be honest and admit to yourself that this is pride; this is your sin. Try to reflect upon the ideal and humble way you should respond when confronted by another. If reconciliation is your number-one priority in any relationship that has experienced hurt, then that holy and humble desire will become your guide to being able to reconcile with everyone in your life.

#### ~The Curate's Corner~ ~Return~

The Church faces many challenges today. Certainly, the culture is changing and more and more the Church stands alone in her beliefs. Still, I'm convinced that the most pressing issue of our time is the loss of our own people. The statistics tell us that in western countries like Australia, for every one person who joins the Church, we are losing six more, and that fifty percent of young people who were raised Catholic are no longer Catholic today. And this is just the statistic for religious identification, mass attendance figures are far more devastating. The Catholic Church is haemorrhaging people, and young people particular. We're seeing the truth that while we have grandchildren, God does not. God only has children, and each generation must meet Christ and the Church for themselves. Relying only on culture and family traditions to hand on the faith just doesn't work.

But behind these statistics are real people: they are our children, our grandchildren, and our siblings. Behind these figures are wounded families, and maybe we are one of the countless mothers and fathers who are longing for our child to come back to the Church, crying: "where did we go wrong?" I'm sure we know the scene, that we shuffle uncomfortably in the pews at Christmas and Easter as we realise our family members no longer know the responses at mass anymore, let alone going to confession regularly or keeping the Eucharistic fast. Maybe we've had the awkward conversation at our dinner table when it comes to light that our child doesn't really think our faith is credible or worth listening to anymore. I'm sure we've been in one of the situations, and certainly we know others who have.

And for a long time, many in the Church have suggested that we just relax, and that if people are good that's all that really matters. But hopefully by now one thing is clear, the passive wait and see approach is no longer an option. It simply doesn't work, we need a different strategy. We need to understand the real reasons why our family and friends leave the Church, and we need a game plan to bring them home. So, for the next few months we're going to look at practical strategies to bring them back home again, no fluff or platitudes, but proven Catholic strategies.

#### ~Something to think about~

When it comes to family members who have fallen away from the faith, we can sometimes feel despair, believing there's no chance they'll ever come back. But sometimes we can also be tempted to put our heads in the sand, ignoring that our children never practice their faith, and to keep the peace make no effort to do something about it. Neither of these positions are helpful though. So, this week let's start praying for this particular intention, and by the grace of God let's commit to the journey to bring them back home.
