You have laid down your precepts to be carefully kept; may my ways be firm in keeping your statutes.

REFLECTION: A close read of today's Gospel shows us that the landowner paid on the terms that were negotiated. The landowner, it seems, has acted completely justly. The parable goes beyond that, the landowner is radically just; He has given those who laboured in the field for a full day their due pay. But he has also given a full-day's wage to those who worked only a single hour. No one is cheated, but a few receive abundantly from the landowner just as we receive from God more than what is merely justifiable or due. God, like the landowner, is radically just and abundantly generous. The workers who complain, lament the fact that landowner has made all workers equal. The parable reminds us that although God owes us nothing, he offers abundantly and equally. We are occasionally tempted to think that our own actions deserve more reward, more of God's abundant mercy, than the actions of others. But God's generosity cannot be quantified or partitioned into different amounts for different people. When we think that way, we are trying to relate to God on our rather terms than to accept God's radically different ways.

~The Curate's Corner~ Return

Before we can begin drawing up a game plan to win our family and friends back to the faith, we must take another look at the obstacles that lay in our path. So, this week we'll expose some of the myths that obscure our vision and prevent us from seeing the path forward.

Myth 1: I took my children to Mass and sent them to Catholic Schools, that should have been enough, right?

In the past children attended Catholic school, played in Catholic sporting clubs, and found their spouse at Catholic dinner dances. They lived in a Catholic world. But that isn't the case anymore, and

most children leave Catholic schools with little or no faith. And as tempting as it is to blame the schools- many certainly do leave a lot to be desiredthe truth is that no one can replace parents when it comes to handing on the faith. And parents cannot hand on what they do not have themselves. What's more the sacraments are not magic, so without adequate formation there's a good chance our children won't be open to the grace that flows through them.

Myth 2: They've left the Church and it's all my fault, I've failed as a parent.

There are almost always multiple reasons why someone leave the Church, so it's not all our fault. Certainly, no parent is perfect, and it's likely we contributed something to our child's drifting away, but we can't ignore the influence of school and work friends, spouses, and the stresses of life in our child's decision. And ultimately, it's their decision not ours. So, if we need to, let's make a good confession, but don't let guilt and shame paralyse vou. And while we may have contributed to their drifting away we can certainly contribute to their coming back.

Myth 3: They won't listen to me; it's impossible to have a conversation about faith.

I'm sure we've had the experience that mentioning "God" or "Church" or "Catholicism" can trigger off a violent reaction in someone we love. Very often they just aren't willing to discuss why they left the Church, and this leaves us so frightened we can't even speak about our faith, let alone theirs. But as we'll see later fruitful discussions are possible. especially when we focus on the experience of the person.

Myth 4: It's hopeless; my child is never coming back to the Church.

We must know with absolute certainty that God never gives up on us. Just remember the parable of the prodigal son: before the son even has a chance to apologise, his father runs and throws his arms around him. The point of the parable is clear. No matter how far our child has drifted from God, no matter what sort of promiscuity or problems or darkness they have fallen into, God will never give up on them. It may require a miracle, a complete change in their thinking, acting and lifestyle. But all things are possible with God.

Something to think about

This week let's get rid of the idea that there's no hope. We should examine our short comings as parents, and confess our sins, but there is always hope, and if we commit to this journey we will soon know it well.
