GOSPEL: Matthew 21:28-32

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

Remember your word to your servant, O Lord, by which you have given me hope. This is my comfort when I am brought low.

REFLECTION: Today's Gospel is about heeding God's word and recognising the Kingdom of God. The parable highlights obedience, given the same task by their father, one son asserts his disobedience in words, but then obeys in his actions; the second son obeys with his words, but disobeys in his actions. Jesus then posed the question: Which son did what the father wanted? All would agree that "actions speak louder than words" and that even if his words were disobedient, the son who did the work as ordered did the father's will. Jesus' conclusion is direct. The chief priests and elders, the ones who speak most often about God, did not act accordingly. They did not respond to the message of repentance announced by John the Baptist with a change of heart. Instead, John's message was heeded by those one would not expect to repent—tax collectors, prostitutes, and other sinners. Because of their repenting actions, these sinners will enter the Kingdom of God ahead of the religious leaders. Jesus could ask us the same question today. Do our words indicate our obedience to God? If not our words, do our actions? God desires a full conversion of heart, that our actions (and our words as well) will give evidence of our love for God.


Child Protection Unit - Certificates


<u>Carpet Fundraiser – Book Drive</u>

~The Curate's Corner~

Return. Hopefully we are now itching to hear how we can get our children back into the Church. So, for the next few weeks we'll begin by looking at what not to do, and then what we should be doing.

Don't force them to go to Mass. Now you might be surprised to hear me say this, but don't force your child to come to Mass. To be clear, I am speaking here about adult children. It's your duty as parents to take young children to Mass, but forcing older children to come to mass is often counter-productive. You see, Mass was never intended to evangelise the uninterested. Yes, anything is possible with God, but without proper instruction our children will miss the point of what's going on and think it's just a bit boring. But more than boring the uninitiated, receiving the Eucharist when we're not ready can do real harm. St Paul writes to the Corinthians, "Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself." His point is that if we haven't confessed our sins, if we're not in right relationship with God and we receive the Eucharist, it's a sacrilege, it's desecrating something that's sacred. Obviously, this is not our intention as concerned family members, but it helps to remember that the Mass is an act of worship, it's the fruit of our union with Christ and not the beginning of it. So rather than forcing our child to come to Mass, let's focus on building a spiritual foundation which will make him want to go to Mass instead of being forced to go

Don't be overly critical of their moral life. If our child is struggling to believe in Jesus, the most dangerous problem they have is unbelief, not the fact that they are living with someone before marriage or get drunk all the time. Here it's important to focus more on the cause of the sickness than its symptoms. Often, we are inclined to start the faith conversation with, "you shouldn't be doing this" but if we start the conversation there, it will never get very far. And it's because the moral law of the Church only make sense if we know who Christ is and love him. Moral laws are given precisely to protect the love he has for us. Also, it's good to remember that our goal as parents is not behaviour modification, it's conversion. We want a child who loves the Lord and will do anything for him. So, we must resist the temptation to frequently highlight the foolishness of their decisions for the real goal of conversion. We don't need to stand idly by either, but we must not unnecessarily risk severing a relationship which can already be on tender hooks.

Something to think about. This week let's consider the times we may have fallen into these errors with our children and let's commit to avoid them in the future.
