The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.

<u>REFLECTION</u>: In today's Gospel, Jesus once again speaks to the priests and elders with a parable. In this parable, the landowner leases his vineyard to tenants and sends his servants to collect the portion of the harvest that the tenants owe to him. Each time they are beaten and killed by the tenants and finally, the landowner sends his son to collect his rent. The tenants plot together and kill the landowner's son believing that they will inherit the vineyard. The chief priests and elders listening to the parable all agree that the landowner will kill the wicked tenants and give the land to new tenants who will pay the rent. Jesus goes on to explain the meaning of the parable: the Kingdom of God will be taken from the unbelieving and given to the faithful. The chief priests and elders have condemned themselves with their answer to Jesus' question. This Gospel reminds us of the importance of listening to God's word. God speaks to us in many ways—through Scripture, through our Church tradition, in our Church's teaching, and through modern-day prophets. Are we attentive and receptive to God's word to us through these messengers?

Earthquake in Morocco



Amen. - San Francesco d'Assisi (1181-1226) *Return.* Last week we saw that forcing our adult children to go to mass and being overly critical of their moral lives are likely to drive them even further from the Church. Today we will look at some more unhelpful behaviours to avoid in our quest to win them back to the faith.

Don't Nag. Nagging almost never works, in fact, it usually has the opposite effect. People often stay away from the Church simply because someone is always nagging them about religion. Now it must be said, we nag because we want the other person to feel our pain, but when it comes to faith, we must face the fact that our fallen away children almost certainly don't think it's as important as we do. And so passive aggressive comments or the over-the-top religious emails or text messages often have the effect of making them think that Christianity is even crazier than they already thought it was. But as Pope St John Paul II reminds us, "the Church proposes; she imposes nothing." So, parents who successfully draw their children back to the Church don't nag or complain about their child's deficiencies but invite them to something better.

Don't dismiss their objections. It's likely our children encountered a lot of objections to the faith when they went off to university or entered the workforce. There was likely a moment when they were made to feel embarrassed about their Catholic upbringing as if it was something to be ashamed of. So, most of their objections to faith are likely ideas just parroted from what their friends or coworkers have said, rather than ideas they have seriously considered. But one sure way of making our children dig their heels in and solidifying their departure from the Church, is to quickly dismiss their objections. And let's be honest it's likely they were taught incorrect or watered down versions of the faith that do need correction. So, no matter how silly their objections may sound, let's take them seriously, because the more we respect our child's concerns the more open they will be to our responses.

Don't assume you can change them. In the Gospel Jesus tells the parable of the sower who scattered seeds on the ground. Some seeds are eaten by the birds, some fall on rocky paths or amid the weeds and some fall on good soil. The point of the parable is that we can't control when, how, or whether our seeds will produce fruit. And this doesn't mean that we should stop caring about what happens to our child, but that we acknowledge that their return to the Church is only partially in our hands. And so more than anything we need to entrust our children to the works of God rather than our own works.

Something to think about. Let's consider some of our behaviours which may push people away instead of drawing them into the faith. Again, let's acknowledge these faults, confess our sins, and commit to avoiding them in the future.
