REFLECTION: The significance of the gospel reading for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary of the wedding banquet is evident in that Jesus uses it as a medium to shed light on our relationship with God. The initial rejection by the invited guests draws parallels with how the Jewish community treated God's messages and messengers. This neglect to attend the feast speaks volumes about missed opportunities and neglecting divine calls. The invitation's extension to everyone, irrespective of their background or deeds, demonstrates God's inclusive nature. It highlights the idea that salvation and God's love are available to all. However, there's an underlying message. Simply showing up isn't enough. One must also come prepared, spiritually and mentally, to partake in the divine feast. The guest without the wedding attire serves as a cautionary tale. While the invitation is open to all, it's crucial to be prepared and sincere in our approach. This can be interpreted as the need for genuine faith and commitment to God. Just as attending a wedding requires appropriate attire, embracing God's love requires genuine devotion and preparedness.

Earthquake in Morocco

Caritas agencies are responding to the 6.8 magnitude earthquake where more than 2600 lives have been lost and thousands have been injured. Many families are spending sleepless nights outdoors, fearing aftershocks. Search and rescue efforts are ongoing. Immediate needs include getting essentials like food, clean water, emergency shelter and medicine to families affected by the earthquake, while preparing for the long-term needs of people who no longer have homes to return to. 
St Vincent De Paul

~The Curate's Corner~

Return: Hopefully our minds our echoing, I want to show my child Christ, I want to show my child Christ. Remember the parable of the man who finds a great treasure buried in a field and sells everything to buy the field. Well, he doesn't buy the field first, he finds the treasure first. And this is the secret to drawing our child back to the Church. They need to find the treasure, and only after finding Christ will they want to be a part of the Church. Now you might think your child is especially hard case, and that's ok, because Jesus dealt with those all the time. But remember how he does it. On one occasion when the disciples cannot cast out an evil spirit he said, "this kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting." So, prayer, fasting, and sacrifice are essential to our mission.

Prayer: Here's a story. A smart and gifted boy goes off to study. He makes new friends. They spend most of their time partying, and soon he's forgotten everything he was taught about God. Eventually he moves in with his girlfriend, they have a child, and the boy's mother watches on in despair, with nothing to do but pray. This is the story of many Catholics today, and maybe it's your own story. But it's not a new one, in fact it's the story of St Monica and he young wayward son, Augustine. St Monica was raised a Christian, but her husband didn't care, and their marriage was rocky. But St Monica just kept praying. And eventually her husband and her son converted, and Augustine became one of the greatest saints in history. So, what can we learn from her experience? Well, don't stop praying for your child, and if you feel like you can't speak to your child about God, don't stop speaking to God about them. Next, don't just pray for our child. Ultimately St Ambrose, another holy man, convinced Augustine to become Catholic. So, we should pray that God will bring someone else into our child's path, someone with the right combination of personality, interests, intelligence, and heart. So, let's pray for that person. Lastly, be convinced that prayer works. If our prayer is little more than a list of complaints, and half-hearted prayers said every now and then, are we really surprised our child hasn't converted? We need to seriously pray; it should be one of our top priorities. St Francis de Sales said, "Half and hour's prayer each day is essential, except when you are busy. Then a full hour is needed."

Four ways to pray for your child: 1. Commit to praying the rosary everyday for a month for the conversion of your child and see what happens. 2. Pray a novena for your child. For centuries Catholics have prayed like the Apostles in the upper room, praying 9 straight days for a particular intention. The website www.praymorenovenas.com has a long list of novenas. 3. Spend one hour a week in front of the blessed Sacrament. Dedicate this holy hour to your child, but you might also find that time spent with the Lord begins to soften your heart too. 4. Offer a mass for your child's intention or ask a devout parishioner to pray for them. It really does take a parish to pray for a child.
