The Lord said: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction. You will call upon me, and I will answer you, and I will lead back your captives from every place.

GOSPEL: Matthew 25:14-30

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

REFLECTION: The Parable of the Talents in this Sunday's Gospel focuses on the idea of stewardship and responsible use of resources. It encourages people to make the most of what they have, rather than hoarding or hiding it. The servants who doubled their talents took initiative and were rewarded, whereas the one who buried his was rebuked. The message in the gospel for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A is about action and accountability. It tells us that what we're given whether it's money, skills, or opportunities—should be utilized for a greater good. The idea is to grow and multiply these gifts, presumably for the benefit of the community or, in the religious context, for the Kingdom of God. Fear holds back the third servant, and he fails to do anything productive. His approach is caution to the point of inaction, and he's criticized for it. The parable suggests that doing nothing with your resources or abilities is not an option; it's a failure to meet a basic responsibility. Overall, the gospel for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A is a call to make the most of what you're given, for the benefit of both yourself and others. It pushes the point that being a good steward of your gifts is a key part of ethical and religious life.

Family Group Event "Meet and Greet"




Dear Parishioners, our last family group event was a big success with 23-30 people attending with quite a few new people attending as well. We enjoyed a shared lunch, we played

NOVEMBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

I'm guessing you've been at Mass and heard the priest say, "Today I'm offering the Mass for..." or heard someone ask the priest, "Father, would you offer a Mass for..." But what does it mean to offer the Mass for someone?

Well, there is a longstanding tradition in the Church that priests offer Mass for a specific intention. The intention might be for someone who's sick, or someone who's died, or just in thanksgiving for a blessing received. And we do this, because the priest is the one who acts "in persona Christi" (in the person of Christ). He shares in Christ's priesthood and brings its powerful effects into our lives. So, when the priest offers Mass for a specific intention special grace may be obtained because it is Christ himself who prays for this intention.

Now when making this request, it is customary to make an offering to the priest. That by offering up something of our own, something we've worked hard for, we unite ourselves more closely with Christ who offers himself in the sacred Host. A monetary offering is a physical expression of the spiritual offering we make at the altar, in union with the offering at Calvary.

But it needs to be stated very clearly that there is never any charge for a Mass to be offered for a particular intention and that the offering is not a payment for the Mass nor is it a payment for the name of the deceased or sick person to be in the newsletter. The priest will always offer Mass for a particular intention regardless of the offering. And to avoid any abuses, the Church regulates this practice in the Code of Canon Law. During the month of November it is customary for Catholics to ask that Mass be offered for the repose of the soul of their deceased relatives and friends. In this month we pray with particular intensity for the souls of the dead, because we believe in the purification of the soul from the hurt caused by sin. If we're being honest, it might just be the case that we do not die in a state of perfect holiness, free of every attachment to sin, and so before a soul is able to see God face to face it must be purified. So just as we pray for each other and share each other's burdens now, we can also offer prayers and sacrifices to help the departed souls in purgatory, and there is no better prayer of intercession that could be offered than that of the Mass because it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father. So, if this is something you are used to doing, keep it up; but if you've never offered a Mass for your loved ones, I really encourage you to do so this November. If you wish to have a Mass offered for your deceased relatives or friends this November, special envelopes will be available in the pews, and these can be placed in the collection baskets or returned to the Parish Office or directly to one of the priests.

~The Curate's Corner~

Return. Having a conversation with our child about their faith can seem overwhelming, because if we're being honest, we don't have all the answers. But that's ok! What's even more important is asking the right questions. So, this Sunday, we'll look at five specific questions to help guide our conversation.

- 1. What do you believe about ____? We might assume that our child knows what the Church teaches on a topic and has rejected that. But given the state of Catholic education over the last few generations, it's almost a safe bet they've never received a full presentation of the truth and are most likely rejecting a caricature of what the Church teaches. So, it's important to figure out exactly what they believe, and to help them identify and refine what they hold to be true.
- 2. Why do you think that's true? We all believe certain things without ever asking why it's true, but for a belief to be justified, we should have good reasons or evidence to support it. And as Catholic we have very good reasons for what we believe, and the Church's account of reality is what fits our daily experience the best. So, asking "why do you think that's true?" about some belief our child holds will gently help them to discover that maybe their reasons for rejecting the Church aren't that convincing or maybe they don't exist at all. Helping them to see this for themselves, will be useful later.
- 3. What do you mean by _____? When we're talking about faith with our children there's a good chance we might not be on the same page. For example, if our child has trouble with God, or no longer believes in him, we first want to ask, "Well, when you say that God doesn't exist, can you describe what you mean by God?" Chances are the God they find problematic is one we would too. They might not believe in a God who physically lives in the sky and is like some sort of moral policeman who broods over the world and enjoys taking away our freedom and joy. But as Catholics we don't believe that either. So, until we are both clear on who God is, we can't continue the conversation on his existence. And the same holds true for words like faith, religion, Church, goodness, and belief.
- 4. What would you say to someone who says? It's important that our conversation doesn't become a shootout. This is not about us versus them. One way to help our child not to feel personally attacked, is if we pose questions hypothetically or in the third person. It should be like, "let me suggest an alternative, and tell me if you think it's an improvement on what you believe. If not, can you tell me why your option is better."
- 5. What's the biggest thing keeping you away from the Church? Once we've begun listening to our child's responses, we need to identify what's holding them back from the Church. And it's best to just ask directly, "what really bugs you about the Church?" and whatever the objection is, that's what we need to address. Now, be ready for anger, sarcasm, or dismissiveness, because there's a big chance our questions will push on wounds and sins our child has not come to terms with. But be patient, we are walking towards the truth together.
