1st SUNDAY IN ADVENT YEAR B

3rd December 2023

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 63:16-17,64:1,3-8

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Mark 13:33-37

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

The Lord will bestow his bounty, and our earth shall yield its increase.

REFLECTION: Advent is a time for looking both backward and forward. We look backward as we prepare to celebrate the historical birth of Jesus of Nazareth at Christmas. Before that birth people longed for the Messiah who would restore Israel to her former power. We identify with that ancient longing for restoration as we await Christ's coming more fully into our lives and, also as we await His Second Coming. With that longing for restoration in mind, we recognize in Advent a time of preparation and anticipation. What we celebrate as having happened in the past points to what we anticipate is coming again. First, we recognize that Christ is born into our lives each day as we open ourselves to His grace and love. These moments of discovering birth in Christ are times when we can stand with the shepherds and hear glad tidings proclaimed. Advent is a season that prepares us to discover new birth happening over and over again for us in and thru Christ. We celebrate those birth times at Christmas. Second, we look forward in Advent to the culmination of Christ's kingdom, when He will return in glory to fulfill the promise of wholeness as all creation responds to His healing presence. In our acclamation during the Eucharistic Prayer, we identify with this longing when we say "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again," or similar words in the other acclamations. Through the Holy Spirit, this new age has already begun, and this too we celebrate.

Advent Prayer

O Lord, as we enter this season of Advent, fill me with the hope of Christ. Help me to wait in great expectation for your great light to shine in this world, for all who are living in darkness to see the dawning of your light. May your light fill all the darkest corners of this world and may your love conquer all despair and hate, leading us all to a better life in you. This is the hope of Christmas, that the birth of a baby – Jesus Christ, your Son – will change the world, and will work a change in my own life. Lord, I pray to be filled with this hope that light will triumph over darkness, love will conquer evil, and Jesus will save us all. This I pray through your Son Jesus Christ, Amen.

~The Curate's Corner~ Return. So hopefully it's been a few months since we

started evangelising our child. Now we're praying for them every day, offering up small sacrifices for their return, and we're beginning to have conversations about the faith. But we can't stop there, we must keep going! *Invite.* The Gospels show that most people follow Christ because he asks them to. And if we look carefully at these moments, it's not just because he asks, but because they want what he offers. And it will be no different with our children. Once they've shown some curiosity, we need to invite them into the life of the Church, to credible witnesses who are full of zeal. But zeal is not the same as being overly intense, so be mindful of who might scare them away. Still, it's very important they meet a priest. He will be able to talk to your child, find out what's happening in their life, and will know what it's going to take to bring them back. And while we don't want to encourage a pick and choose attitude to our faith, we might consider which priest would be best suited to give them a positive experience.

Make a good confession. If our child has been away for some time, they're going to need healing and forgiveness. Like the prodigal son, sorrow and contrition are not the end of the story. Rather it ends with the father's embrace, a symbol of forgiveness and reconciliation. Still, it's likely they'll be nervous about this big step, just like we still sometimes get nervous about going to confession. So, to calm their apprehension we might tell them not to worry about how to make a good confession, because the priest will guide them through everything. Also, if it makes them more comfortable, they can confess to a priest they don't know.

Acknowledge obstacles and find a way forward. It's true our Lord meets us where we're at, but he doesn't want us to stay there. So, there might need to be some conversations about situations that hinder their path back to the Church. Unfortunately living together before marriage has quickly become the norm for young couples. They might think it's financially sensible, or a good trial run for marriage, but in almost every case cohabitation involves a sexual relationship. And this falls short of the Catholic moral vision, which rejects any sexual act outside of marriage. This is why talking to a priest is crucial. He will be able to avoid both immediate condemnation and ignoring the cohabitation and show your child a path back to God. It's also possible that our child has assisted in or had an abortion. And this harms not only the child who loses their life but everyone else who must live with what's happened. But there is no sin that God cannot forgive. So, if our child has been involved in an abortion, it's best they contact a priest to start the journey of healing. A final situation keeping our child away from the Church might be divorce and remarriage. While this situation will be addressed in depth later, we can say that while it may not be possible for them to receive Holy Communion, they are still a member of the Church, and the Lord still reaches out to them. If we have the desire, we can always find our way back to God, or rather he will always find his way into our hearts.
