O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

SECOND READING: 2 Peter 3:8-14

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Mark 1:1-8

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

Jerusalem, arise and stand upon the heights, and behold the joy which comes to you from God.



REFLECTION: In today's gospel, John the Baptist is baptizing people in preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ. The passage begins by referencing the prophets Isaiah and Malachi, indicating that John the Baptist's ministry is a fulfillment of prophecy. This theme underscores the continuity of God's plan as revealed through the prophets. Preparation for the Messiah: John's role as a forerunner for Christ highlights the theme of preparation for the coming of the Messiah. His preaching and baptizing in the wilderness were meant to prepare the hearts and minds of the people for Jesus. John's declaration that he is not worthy to untie the sandals of the one coming after him illustrates his humility. It sets an example for the proper attitude of a servant of God, acknowledging one's own unworthiness in comparison to Christ. The act of baptism in the Jordan River by John symbolizes purification and repentance. This ritual act points to the inner transformation that is required for a renewed relationship with God. John distinguishes his baptism with water from the coming baptism with the Holy Spirit by Jesus. This theme introduces the Holy Spirit's significant role in Christian life and points to the deeper, transformative work that Jesus will accomplish. John's ministry marks the transition from the prophetic tradition of the Old Testament to the new era inaugurated by Jesus. This theme reflects the shift from the law and prophets to the grace and truth brought by Christ.

2nd Sunday in Advent Prayer



O holy, patient, and loving God, in this season of grace-filled longing, we await the coming of your Son and our Savior. It is difficult for us to remember that

this is a holy time. There are many distractions: commitments seem to pile up, and expectations are high. In the midst of our busy world, our busy lives, we need your help to remind us of what is important and necessary. While many of those things that we do not need will come to us in packages gleaming and bright, the one gift that will last comes from you alone, gracious God, as we grow in our awareness of your love. Bless us, our family and friends, and the food and the company that we share. Increase in us a growing urgency to celebrate the birth of your Son, in whose name we pray. Amen.

Return. Hopefully we're getting to the bottom of why our child is no longer interested in the Church. And our conversations may have brought up some theological and moral objections, but it's likely personal experience is at the heart of why they're not coming. So today we'll look at how to respond to some of these.

"Mass is boring and I don't have time for it." <u>Response:</u> "You won't want to miss Mass once you learn what's really going on."

Often, it's not the case that our child has thought about the faith and disagrees. Instead, they just want to sleep in, or take kids to sport, or find Mass boring. And it's true, Mass is long and boring if you don't love God. But the cure is not to make Mass more modern as some keep saying, rather it's to help our child fall in love with God. So, if he says Mass is boring, acknowledge that, don't dismiss it. Mass is not meant to be repetitive and boring

but life-giving and powerful. This will make them more open to what you have to say next, namely what is Mass and why it matters. If they see that Mass is the making present again of Calvary, it's not a social gathering, and that Holy Communion is the body and blood of Christ, not bread and wine, they'll no longer think Mass is boring.

"The Church is too focused on rules and making people feel guilty."

Response: "The Church doesn't add to our guilt; it takes it away."

People love to joke about "Catholic" guilt, but Catholicism is the answer to the guilt we already have. Through Baptism and Confession God forgives our sins. We're great at sinning, but God is even better at forgiving. And his plans are much better than anything we could come up with. Our child might say the Church has too many rules, but these exist to keep us from taking wrong turns and heading down paths that only lead to emptiness and misery. And if they disagree, ask why depression, anxiety, and suicide are so common since society has replaced God with technology and our own will. God's plan makes us free.

"The Church is full of hypocrites."

<u>Response:</u> "The Church is full of sinners, but our faith is in Christ not sinful men."

I'm sure we know of a priest who's been unfaithful. Maybe it was abuse, or running off with a woman, or drinking too much, stealing Church money or just being lazy. The Church is full of sinners, and many are priests. So, if our child brings up this objection, who can blame them for being upset. We should affirm their disappointment, and only after this suggest a few points to bring them around. Firstly, the overwhelming majority of priests are not criminals and low lives, but men trying their best. And these problems are not unique to the Church: schools, sporting clubs, the defence force and many businesses also face these issues. And lastly, we shouldn't be surprised that the Church is full of sinners. It's not a justification but more proof that we need a saviour.

"I had a bad experience and I can't see myself coming back."

<u>Response:</u> "I'm sorry that happened, but the Church is bigger than one bad parish or priest."

Maybe a homily, or experience in confession, or a rude parishioner has rubbed our child the wrong way. There are many potentially bad experiences because the Church is full of sinners. So, if a bad experience is keeping our child away from the Church we should say, "I'm sorry that happened," but then suggest that a bad experience shouldn't colour our entire perception of the Church. If we're honest, we've been rude or offensive heaps of times; not because we're good Christians, but because we need healing and forgiveness. So, they might avoid a certain parish or priest for some time if they're still hurting, but let's help them see that a bad experience is not worth cutting ourselves off from the source of life and grace.
