REFLECTION: Today's Gospel from Mark describes Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, reflecting the trials and temptations that believers face. Jesus' victory over these temptations, supported by angels and in the presence of wild beasts, symbolizes His divinity and human strength, offering hope and encouragement for followers to overcome their own temptations. Jesus' message after His time in the wilderness focuses on the call to repentance and the urgent announcement of the Kingdom of God. This theme is central to the Lenten journey, urging believers to reflect, turn away from sin, and embrace the Gospel message with renewed commitment. Lent is a season of preparation, mirroring Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness. This time is an invitation for personal and communal reflection, repentance, and preparation for the celebration of Easter, symbolizing the new life and hope that comes from Jesus' resurrection. The themes for the 1st Sunday of Lent Year B invite reflection on God's faithfulness, the significance of baptism, the importance of repentance and conversion, and the strength that comes from God's support in overcoming challenges. They frame Lent as a time to deepen one's faith and commitment to living according to the Gospel. It is time to commit to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence. Fasting means that you can't eat more than one full

meal and two small snacks in a day. Abstinence means that you can't eat meat on that day (meat is any animal that has legs and can walk).

So, it's Lent! And that means it's time to increase our prayer, fasting and almsgiving. But I don't want us to choose Lenten practices that are random and ineffective. So, let's get practical. What are Lenten resolutions? and what can we do for them?

At the heart of what we're doing are the words of Christ, "repent and believe the Good News." So, what are the things we need to repent from? and how can we better believe the good news? That's what our practices should focus on.

Prayer: Prayer is simply our heart speaking to His heart. It's not a monologue or a therapy session but taking time to be with the Lord. It's true we can pray while driving or ironing, but Lent calls us to take some

time each day to drop everything and give our Lord some undivided attention. Because this is where we'll hear the good news! So, think about:

Attending Adoration (A time of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament) Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament is one of the best ways to pray. You might bring the scriptures to read, a note pad to journal with, or a rosary to pray, but I recommend trying to sit there quietly. Here are Adoration times: Hectorville Church: Saturdays 8.30-9.00am

(followed by Mass and Confessions)

Adelaide Cathedral: Tuesdays 6.30-7.30pm (Confessions available)

Our Lady, Queen of Peace Payneham:

Thursdays 7.30-8.30pm (Confessions available) OR attend a weekday Mass.

If you want to become a saint, go to mass frequently! It might not be every day, and the Church doesn't expect this, but try picking one extra day to attend Mass. There's no better way to believe the Good News than by receiving Him in Holy Communion.

Hectorville 7.00am Tuesday to Friday, 9.00am Saturday

Fasting: Fasting trains us to choose what's good for our relationship with Christ, even when it's hard. As a minimum the Church expects us to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and this means no more than one full meal and two snacks (pregnant and nursing mothers, the sick and elderly are exempted.) But that's the bare minimum. In Lent we're called to be generous. So don't eat meat on Friday's and try picking a day each week to fast. But also think about what really leads you to pride, anger, envy, lust, and laziness. Maybe it's the content we consume on our phones or TV's. In that case a fast from technology might be helpful.

Almsgiving: This might be the most misunderstood of the three Lenten practices. Typically, we think giving to the poor is about helping the poor, and it is, but there's a deeper meaning too. We give away our hardearned money because it teaches us that man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Yes, we need food and clothing, but we need God more than these, because only he can give us eternal life. And giving to the poor reminds us of that. So, give money to Project Compassion or some other charity, but this Lent also think about supporting poor priests through the charity Aid to the Church in need. This Catholic charity allows you to offer Masses for a donation, and the money donated supports priests in need. The world needs more Masses and more grace, so try and be generous.
