~The Curate's Corner~ Making a good confession

In this final column on confession, I'd like to answer some questions you might have about the sacrament.

Can a priest tell anyone what he's heard? No! Every confession is covered by the "confessional seal." This means that everything said from the start of the sacrament to its end (from sign of cross to "go in peace") can never be spoken of by the priest to anyone whatsoever. And if the priest breaks this seal he is automatically excommunicated. But the seal only applies to the priest. You will not sin if you repeat something you've said in confession. So, if want to talk to the priest about something you've mentioned later, just start from the beginning so he won't be violating the seal.

Will the priest judge me?

Maybe I should explain what it's like from my side of the curtain. I get to come face to face with the lifetransforming power of God's love. Not many people get to see Christ breaking into people's lives and giving them the consolation they've always longed for, but I do. I get to see a saint in the making. I don't care if you keep confessing the same things; if you're seeking the Sacrament of Reconciliation, it means you're trying. That's all that I care about. But maybe you're thinking, won't Father remember my sins? Honestly, it's rare. You're not the first person to have done this, and you won't be the last. And if I remember anything, it's the beauty of your soul. Confession is the place where I get to see you most clearly with the eyes of Christ. But in Confession I also see my own weakness. So often I hear echoes of my own sin and weakness. And lastly, I get to sacrifice for you. A priest does penance for his penitents. He prays for them, takes on penances for them and sacrifices his own life for them. So, remember, Confession is a place of victory, and I get to be there.

What if I'm confessing the same sins over and over?

It might be that we're confessing the same sins because we're not avoiding the occasions that lead to sin, or not actively fighting against temptation. If that's the case with serious sin, it might be time to ask a priest for some spiritual direction so that you can draw up a plan of attack moving forward. But when it comes to smaller sins, there are some we knowingly choose and others which happen almost without our notice. In the first instance, keep struggling against the sin, but when the sin happens almost without our knowing, we must humbly accept that there are some struggles, some temptations that will always be with us. And bringing these to confession is another opportunity to encounter the love of Christ.

How does a priest deal with hearing confessions?

Honestly, it can be tiring. At times a priest hears hours of confessions without a break, and it takes it out of you. And it's not because your sins are heavy, but because we are another Christ. We weep when you are weeping, we share the weight of your burdens. Not because we're special but because we share in Christ's priesthood and that's what he does. Having said that, it's my practice once I leave the confessional to kneel before the tabernacle, and say, "Lord these are your children, I'll leave them with you." Sometimes a confession can weigh on us, but a priest can't debrief about it to others. So, I do talk it over with the Lord, but he always knows the right thing to say. And so, there can be heaviness, but there's always more joy in getting to be your spiritual father. I wouldn't trade it for anything. ~*Fr Anthony Beltrame*
