REFLECTION:

The fourth Sunday in Lent is known as Laetare Sunday as the Church invites us to rejoice with her (Laetare in Latin means to "rejoice") reminding us that the Lenten season is not a time of grief. The Readings present to us the most important truth in the Bible, expressed through the most celebrated verse in the entire Bible: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). God's definition in the Old Testament is "Tender Love" and "Mercy" (Exodus 34:6-7). Even despite the sin and rebellion of Israel, graphically explained in the book of Chronicles, God does not withdraw His love at all. We should not read calamities in our life as a sign that God has abandoned us. Instead, the calamities could serve as a temporary time of cleansing before God could reinstate us.

~The Curate's Corner~

Q. How long after the death of Jesus were the Gospels written? How do we know they are credible?

This is a tricky question, and many people have spent careers trying to find the answer, but the truth is we don't have an exact date each of the Gospels were written. Afterall there's no signature and date at the bottom, but neither is there for other writings of the period. Traditionally it's been thought they were written from 50-70 AD (20-40 years after the death of Christ), but some argue for a later date, say 70-90 AD. Personally I think the arguments for an earlier date are more compelling, but we know this for certain: the Gospels were written while the Apostles were still alive, they were widely circulated among all the early Christian communities, and all teach the true doctrine (they don't contradict each other).

Q. Why can only men be priests? It might seem like priests just deliver homilies, celebrate the sacraments, and looks after parishes, and surely anyone can do that? Well not quite, and it's because the priesthood isn't just a career, it's a relationship. The priest stands in the person of Christ and continues his ministry across the centuries. And Christ's manhood wasn't accidental. He is a groom and spiritual father, and the Church is his bride and a spiritual mother. And so, reserving the priesthood to men is not a judgement on women and their dignity. Both men and women are called to be saints and build up the Church. Rather, it's that a woman can't be a husband and father just as a man can't be a wife and mother.

Q. Why do some women wear veils to church? We know that most women traditionally wore some sort of head covering to mass, and some still do today, but it's not to ward off the eyes of men. Instead, the significance of the veil is far more dignified. Sacred things in the Church are veiled and it's because of their beauty and dignity. Think of the tabernacle and the chalice. These are two of the most precious things in a Church, and the veil heightens their beauty by giving a sense of mystery and reverence. And this is why women veil. For men though, hats or head coverings are typically a sign of authority (think of a police hat) and that's why they remove them in Church. Also, women have said that wearing a veil helps them stay focused during mass and is helpful reminder they are in a space reserved for God.

Q. What actually happens to change bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ? When we think of transubstantiation (the change of the bread and wine) we typically think of what the Eucharist is. And certainly, the whole substance (what it is) of bread and wine is changed into the substance of the Body and Blood of Christ. This change happens in the eucharistic prayer through the words of Christ and by the action of the Holy Spirit. But the real question is, who is the Eucharist? Because the Eucharist is not something but someone. It is Jesus Christ, and our receiving of him, gives us communion with him. That's why the external appearance of the bread and wine doesn't change. God wants us to remember, it's not the flesh and blood of a dead person we're eating and drinking, we're not cannibals. Rather the Eucharist is his living and resurrected body veiled by the appearance of bread and wine.
