REFLECTION:

The 4th Sunday of Easter Year B invites us to reflect on Jesus Christ's role as the Good Shepherd, a theme beautifully unveiled in the Gospel reading. This imagery is not just a metaphor but a deep revelation of Christ's sacrificial love and commitment towards us. Unlike a hired hand who might flee at the first sign of danger, Jesus stands firm, ready to lay down His life for His sheep. This act of ultimate sacrifice is a testament to the depth of His care and concern for us. It's a love that goes beyond duty or obligation. Jesus wants to be our shepherd, guiding us, protecting us, and leading us to pastures of eternal life.

In today's readings for the 4th Sunday of Easter Year B, we are invited to contemplate the nature of this sacrifice. It's a voluntary offering from Jesus, not coerced or done grudgingly but out of a boundless love for humanity. He emphasizes that He lays down His life willingly, with the power to take it up again. This authority and voluntary sacrifice underline the divine mission and the profound love Jesus has for us, highlighting His unique role in God's salvific plan.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Discernment of Spirits in Marriage: Wisdom for Husbands and Wives

Week 3: Grace in a time of anxiety

Spiritual Rule: The third is of Spiritual Consolation. I call it consolation when some interior movement is caused in the soul, through which the soul comes to be inflamed with love of its Creator and Lord; and consequently when it can love no created thing on the face of the earth in itself, but only in the Creator of them

all. Likewise, when it sheds tears that move to love of its Lord, whether out of sorrow for one's sins, or for the Passion of Christ our Lord, or because of other things directly connected with His service and praise. Finally, I call consolation every increase of hope, faith and charity, and all interior joy which calls and attracts to heavenly things and to the salvation of one's soul, quieting it and giving it peace in its Creator and Lord.

Experience: Do you ever worry about your spouse? Does it seem like they are on edge, or distant, and they block your attempts to talk about what's happening? And even though we share a house, a bed and pretty much everything, it can start to feel like we're living with someone we don't really know. We notice there's not the same joy as before, that our conversations and physical interactions feel routine and lack warmth. And when this happens, we can begin to blame ourselves and become discouraged, particularly so when children are involved, and we worry that our marriage is affecting them for the worst. But then we remember something. In the past when there has been tension it's often because a disagreement was simmering in the background. Maybe we couldn't agree on the importance of faith in our marriage, or how many children we should have, or even just the prospect of a career change or moving house, and we could agree on that. And so, we take this tension to prayer. We might sit in front of the blessed Sacrament or a crucifix and just look at it. In that moment, we feel the presence of Jesus and a deep sense of being loved. A warm sense of his presence wells up in our hearts and makes us feel safe and sure of his closeness. Tears well up in our eyes and we experience a healing. It gives us courage to love our spouse again and remember why we loved them in the first place, and now we want to walk with them through their trials.

What's happening here? St Ignatius says that in times of anxiety God moves the heart. On the spiritual level, he stirs our hearts to feel joy, love, gratitude, hope and peace. He gives us the experience of a real sense of Jesus' presence in prayer. Another consolation is when God removes obstacles that block our openness to him. In prayer, our resistance to our spouse and what they're going through suddenly gives way and we are more ready to understand, more ready to help. Another consolation is tears. Often tears come when we think of God's love for us, or the evil of our sin, or the lengths Jesus was willing to go to, to save us. These tears heal us and assure us that Jesus will be with us and our spouse in this difficult time. God also stirs up more faith and hope, he makes us want to come back to adoration, come back to mass, he fills us with a joy that makes us attracted to heavenly things.

What to do? All of us who are trying to love God experience spiritual consolations. Call to mind some of those experiences and how they have blessed you on your spiritual journey. Spiritual consolations are a language through which God speaks to us, open your heart to that now, and give thanks for how he has sustained you along the way.
