GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! Live in me and let me live in you, says the Lord; my branches bear much fruit. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: John 15:1-8



I am the true vine and you are the branches, says the Lord. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, bears fruit in plenty, alleluia.

REFLECTION: Obedience to God's commandments, especially the command to believe in Jesus and love one another, is central to our relationship with God. This obedience is not burdensome but is a natural outcome of our love for God and assures us of His indwelling Spirit. This Sunday's Gospel from John uses the metaphor of the vine and the branches to illustrate the vital connection believers must maintain with Jesus. Just as branches can bear fruit only when attached to the vine, Christians can thrive spiritually only when they remain in Jesus. The theme of fruitfulness permeates the Gospel reading. Believers are called to bear fruit as evidence of their discipleship and their connection to Jesus. This fruitfulness also involves pruning, or spiritual discipline, to foster even greater growth. The ultimate purpose of believers' fruitfulness is to bring glory to God. Our lives, when lived in connection with Christ, reflect God's love and power to the world. Together, these themes present a rich tapestry of Christian life and faith, emphasizing transformation, community, love in action, obedience, connection with Christ, fruitfulness, and the glorification of God.



Discernment of Spirits in Marriage: Wisdom for Husbands and Wives

Week 4: An Evening of Darkness

Spiritual Rule: "The fourth rule is of Spiritual Desolation. I call desolation all the contrary of the third rule, such as darkness of soul, disturbance in it, movement to things low and earthly, disquiet from different agitations and temptations, moving to lack of confidence, without hope, without love, finding oneself

totally lazy, tepid, sad, and as if separated from his Creator and Lord. Because, as consolation is contrary to desolation, in the same way the thoughts which come from consolation are contrary to the thoughts which come from desolation."

Experience: Sometimes as husbands and wives we have days, weeks and even months, that leave us thinking "why is life so hard?" We know our spouse feels it too, they want to talk about it, but we're too ashamed and keep them at a distance. Our old habits return, and the new ones we were trying to form disappear. We want to improve our relationships, but nothing seems to work.

Here's a typical day: Work was tiring; we didn't stop from morning till night. Things didn't go as we planned, people got upset with us and our efforts seemed to count for little. At home things aren't much better. The kids are loud and getting on our nerves, and it feel like we're walking on eggshells with our spouse. After dinner, we sit alone, everything seems heavy and dark. We feel troubled and discouraged. Familiar voices sound within, "You'll never change, why keep making these useless efforts... and those consolations you felt before, they didn't last for long did they?" We sit there. Our prayer book inches from one had, and our phone inches from the other. We look at the prayer book and feel nothing, everything in us wants to reach for the phone. Still, we know what happens when we reach for the phone. Five minutes turn into an hour, and by the end of it we feel emptier and more worthless than before.

What's happening here? This is what St Ignatius calls spiritual desolation. It's a heavy movement of the heart that makes us feel sad, discouraged, hopeless, anxious, and far from God. Notice how it works in the experience we've just heard. This evening, we feel troubled, anxious, and tempted. Old voices come flooding back saying "you'll never change," and it leaves us with no desire to pray, and no sense of God's presence in our life. This is spiritual desolation; and everyone experiences it. It's simply what happens when we live in a fallen, redeemed and loved world. There's no shame in experiencing desolation, but what does matter is to be aware of it, to know that it's a tactic of the devil, and to firmly reject it. What to do? Here's a question: what if we're not aware of spiritual desolation, if we don't understand it's a tactic of the enemy and don't reject it? What direction will our life move in tomorrow, a month from now, or even five years from now? But what if, by God's grace and some courage, we become aware of this experience, understand it for a discouraging lie of the enemy, and reach out for the prayer and relationships we know will lead us to God. The consequences in either case are significant. Let's suppose that we reach out for the phone. What impact will this loss of prayer have on our marriage, our work life, our witness as a Christian. But what if we reach out for the prayer book, how will this growth in prayer impact our marriage, our role as a father or mother, our work, our Christian witness. It matters that we recognise and reject spiritual desolation, and it matters that we do it in the ordinary moments of each day. Imagine if we can be aware of, name and reject spiritual desolation. Imagine the joy, hope and fruitfulness of such a life.
