REFLECTION:

God, imaged in the gospel passage as “Father”, loves Jesus. Jesus remains or abides in God’s love so deeply that this love flows on to his friends. They are to love one another as Jesus has loved them. This is his commandment or commission to them, and by extension to us. It directs them/us to live for each other and put their lives/our lives on the line for one another. It means being faithful to the teaching of Jesus as he has been faithful to God’s commandments. Remaining in the love of God or of Jesus and doing what God or Jesus commands seem to be one and the same thing. In other words, love is not just an emotion: it is always expressed in action that is in tune with and for the sake of the other. The disciples need no further explanation. Jesus’ whole life and his courage in the face of impending death have shown them what it means to love one another. Living in the friendship of Christ’s disciples is not some abstract goal. As we approach the end of the Easter season, we might give thanks for the love of our friends, for their witness to holiness and for the joy that they bring to our lives.

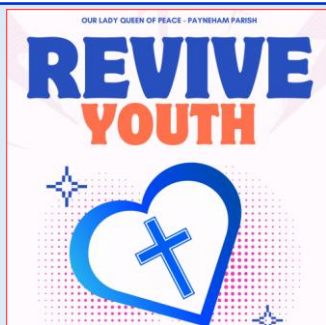

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

We invite parishioners to come to our **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** Information Session on **Saturday 11th May, 2pm-3pm** at 'Visitation Atrium' 13 North Street (in the original Church).



COGS is a religious program based on the Montessori method of education. Children come to one session per week and learn to grow closer to Jesus through Prayer, Scripture and Liturgy: working with models like the Good Shepherd, Nativity, Last Supper. We have a small Altar with replica child-size Mass vessels, as well as many other works. Sessions run during school terms:

Level 0: Thurs 10-11am (0-3yrs, with parent)

Discernment of Spirits in Marriage: Wisdom for Husbands and Wives

Week 5: What you should never do

Spiritual Rule: "In time of desolation never make a change; but be firm and constant in the resolutions and determination you made before such desolation, or in the determinations preceding your consolation. Because, as in consolation it is the good spirit who guides and counsels us, so in desolation it is the bad, and with his counsel we can never decide rightly."

Experience: Sometimes the struggle seems unending. Those days of peace and feeling like we're going somewhere in our relationships, work, and life are a distant memory. In fact, we can't really remember what it felt like to be free, to have no worries.

Here's a typical day: We're too tired to pray, or even if we do have the time we don't want to. Things aren't really going well at work and it's not any better at home. We feel tense, our spouse feels tense, we're short with each other and easily agitated. Those little signs of affection we used to give have gone, or even if they are there, they don't feel the same anymore. The way we're feeling tonight, we don't want to go to mass, we don't want to pray, we don't even want to ask for help.

What's happening here? St Ignatius learned from experience that the enemy will attack our spiritual resolutions – he doesn't want us to become holy. The enemy doesn't want us to pray at a certain time every day, to get to weekday Mass, to attend the faith formation classes in our parish, to pray together as husband and wife, to make our homes into a little church. So, he will afflict us with spiritual discouragement. We will start to question the worth of our faith, and whether there's any point in trying to make a change for the better. Everything will seem too hard, and like it's never going to change. But this is a temptation, it comes from the devil. When we are feeling discouraged, he will try his best to make us give up all the good resolutions we have made. The evil one will want us to give up praying, he'll make Mass seem like a sacrifice that's not worth it, and he'll discourage us from reaching out to someone for help. And so, it's for good reason that St Ignatius says: never decide against good resolutions when you're feeling like this.

What to do? Let's ask ourselves two questions: 1) Am I in a time of spiritual desolation? 2) And am I, in a time of desolation, thinking of changing the plans I had made for my spiritual life before all this started? If the answer to these questions is yes, then we know not to make any changes, because it is the enemy who is suggesting these things to us. On the contrary, we need to stand firm in what we planned before the hard times began. So, whatever we do, when we are feeling discouraged, don't give up or change course on the good spiritual promises we have made. Following the enemy's advice will never lead to the right decision.
