

In today's Gospel, Jesus commanded His disciples to spread the gospel to the world, He assured that miraculous signs would follow believers, including exorcising demons, speaking new languages, and healing the sick. After these instructions, Jesus ascended to heaven. The disciples faithfully preached everywhere, with Jesus confirming their words through signs. Jesus instructs His apostles to wait for the Holy Spirit. This shows the importance of patience and reliance on God's timing for empowerment. Paul speaks about living in humility and maintaining peace. He highlights the role of diverse spiritual gifts in strengthening the community's faith and unity. Jesus command to his disciples to preach the gospel globally, illustrates the universal call to evangelize and spread the message of salvation. The Gospel mentions miraculous signs that will accompany believers, this demonstrates the power of faith and God's active presence in the work of evangelization. Jesus' ascension into heaven is central to all the readings today and it signifies His divine authority and the fulfillment of His earthly mission. These themes for the Feast of the Ascension Year B reflect the journey and responsibilities of Christians in their faith and interactions with

Mother's Day Quote

"The Angels have not been blessed with such a grace. They cannot share in God's Creative miracle to bring new Saints to Heaven. Only a human mother can. Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creatures. God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation."



A Mother's Gaze

There's a certain look that only a mother can give. It's that look of unimaginable love as she first lays eyes upon on you, her newborn child. It's that look that says, "you're in trouble," when you should have known better. It's that look of sadness mingled with quiet acceptance as you leave for a long trip or begin a new adventure in life. I'm sure we know these looks well, and they signify the deepest and most familiar love a person has for us. But like all things familiar, we can sometimes take our mums for granted. So today I'd like to reflect on the gift of motherhood and consider what we can learn from our mums.

Our mothers and fathers did not make us but receive us as a gift from God. A gift not to be dominated or controlled but nurtured and loved; a gift to be received knowing that one day it will have to be handed back to God. And this is not an easy gift to receive; we know it's our tendency to grab hold and take control of the good things that come to us. This however is not the way of motherhood and fatherhood, and it's not the way of God. We can see this in the life of Christ. His whole life was directed towards giving his body and blood for us on the cross. In the same way, the whole of a mother's life is directed towards her giving of her body and spirit to conceive, bring into the world, and raise her child. On the cross Jesus did not cling to his equality with the Father but gave his life as an offering. So too, there comes a day in a mother's life where she must not cling to her children but offer them up to the Father as they go into the world and build a life for themselves. But the intimate connection between motherhood and the life of Christ doesn't end there: for it was on the cross that Jesus gave us his Mother. The woman who loved perfectly, and sacrificed perfectly, is now our Mother. Knowing this changes everything. We now have a mother who stands by us and intercedes for us with all love she has for Jesus. And this is good news particularly for those who have lost their mother, or tragically have known only pain and torment at the hands of their earthly mother. On the cross our Lord bring us into his loving embrace of his Mother, an embrace always leads us to him. Sometimes we can be selfish, wanting only what's convenient and pleasurable, but this is not the way of Jesus and it's not the way of motherhood. So today let's not forget our mothers and all they have done for us, and may we be encouraged to be more selfless and sacrificial in all that we do. Let's give our mum a big hug and if that's not possible, at least a phone call with some words of love and a sincere prayer for her. And next time she gives you that look, be grateful and rejoice!

Discernment of Spirits in Marriage: Wisdom for Husbands and Wives

Week 6: When you're alone.

Spiritual Rule: "Although in desolation we should not change our good resolutions, it is very helpful to intensely change ourselves against the desolation. We do

this by insisting more on prayer, meditation, on much examination, and by giving ourselves more to some suitable penance."

Experience: Life can sometimes weigh heavily on us. Maybe we're sitting at our desk at work, or at home alone on the couch, and the problems of the day come flooding in and we can think of little else. Problems at work, problems at home, and a lack of sleep, all combine to leave us with little desire to pray. Other things draw us more: another check of Facebook, one more look at our emails, a scroll through YouTube, or just some ice cream we know we don't need.

If we indulge in these things we know where it will lead. It will solve nothing and only leave us feeling emptier. In our sadness we cry out, "Please be with me Lord, I'm so tired and discouraged, I don't know what to do." Then we turn to the Lord again and ask, "Jesus, what is happening today? What am I feeling? How did it get like this?" As we ponder these questions, we often realise that there is a way forward, that the Lord has brough us this far, and that those mindless and empty distractions won't ever help. With our spirit revived, we can pray once more and can carry on with life.

What's happening here? Last week we learned that in times of desolation we should NOT change our spiritual course. We should stick to the good resolutions and promises we have made to God, because the devil uses discouragement to lead us away from God. But this doesn't mean we should do nothing. Instead, as St Ignatius points out, we should change ourselves. By this he means, we should use the spiritual remedies that always help in times of discouragement: prayer, meditation, examination of conscience and penance. In this experience we see all four spiritual tools at work. Prayer: To pray simply means to ask, and now we ask, "Please be with me Lord." In times of desolation, ask for help. Meditation: This can simply be calling to mind all the times the Lord has helped us. This will give us strength. Examination of Conscience: Some questions are enormously helpful. "Jesus, what is happening today? What am I feeling? How did it get like this?" Simply naming desolation is liberating, but it's even more helpful to find the cause of it. It might be work or relationship difficulties, whatever the case, it's helpful to know. Penance: It's always a good thing to resist the temptation to more distractions, to more food we don't need, to conversations that will just lead to gossip. Resisting such temptations is an act of penance, and it will do us a lot of good.

What to do? What if in times of desolation at home, at work, getting dinner ready, or in any aspect of life, we turn to God with a prayer for help, we call to mind the truths of our faith, we examine what we are feeling and understand why, and we stand our ground with small gestures of penitential courage? We may struggle with desolation for some time, but the struggle will be easier and will end sooner. Then we will be on the road to freedom.
