REFLECTION:

Pentecost Year B marks a crucial event in the Christian calendar, it is when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit to the apostles. The Holy Spirit descends on the disciples, enabling them to speak in diverse languages. This highlights the Spirit's role in empowering believers to communicate God's wonders universally. Paul encourages living according to the Spirit, not the desires of the flesh. This contrast shows the transformation and guidance provided by the Spirit, leading to a life of virtue. Jesus promises the Advocate, the Spirit of truth, who will testify about Him and guide the disciples into all truth, which points to the Spirit's role in continuing Jesus' mission and revealing divine truths on earth. The event of Pentecost illustrates the coming together of diverse peoples through the power of the Holy Spirit. It celebrates both unity and diversity within the Church. Today's reading from Galatians lists the fruits of living in the Spirit, like love, joy, and peace. These qualities are marks of a Christian life deeply rooted in the Spirit. At Pentecost we have a wonderful opportunity to examine how God might want to use us and how the Spirit might enable us.

Floods and Devastation in Kenya



As we reflect on the recent devastating widespread floods that have swept through Kenya, causing loss of life, destruction of homes, crops, livestock, and infrastructure, our thoughts are with the people affected. Of our seven Missionary Priests from Africa, six come from Kenya and we express our prayers and solidarity with them as this tragedy affects their homeland.

The urgency of the situation calls for a compassionate response as much will be needed in recovery efforts. Caritas Australia has launched a targeted Appeal for Kenya titled "Help fight hunger in Kenya" and the Australian Caritas Office has given assurances that monies collected under this Appeal will support the people of Kenya at this time. This special collection will be held next weekend, the 25th and 26th May. 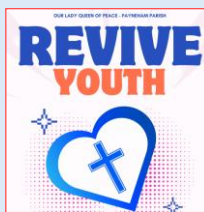
Marian Procession

~The Curate's Corner~

Discernment of Spirits in Marriage: Wisdom for Husbands and Wives

Week 7: The Lie that says, "You can't".

Spiritual Rule: "When you are in desolation, you should be mindful that God has left you to your natural powers to resist the different agitations and temptations of the devil in order to try you. You can resist with the help of God, which always remains, though you may not clearly perceive it. For though God has taken from you the abundance of good feelings and emotions, nevertheless, you have sufficient grace for eternal salvation."

Experience: If we're sincerely trying to follow the Lord, there comes a moment when we're given the opportunity to tell our spouse that we've been struggling, and we need their help. It's a moment of grace, don't miss it! This is what we might tell them: "I'm sorry it took so long to have this conversation, but I need to tell you that I'm struggling spiritually. I think I know the root of it. It's discouragement. It's that awful feeling that I can't do it, that I'll go back to what I was, that I won't be the spouse and parent you need me to be. But now I want to talk to our priest about it." And as your priest, this is what I would say: "This is just discouragement, and it's a normal spiritual experience. It takes effort to resist spiritual desolation, and sometimes we must struggle for a while. But the reason you feel defeated is that you've believed a lie. This lie says that you are defeated before you've begun, that you are helpless, that you can't do it. Of course, the enemy wants you to believe that! But God is faithful and will not let you be tried beyond your strength. You can pray. You can persevere, make spiritual progress, and grow in God's service because God always gives us the grace to stay on track – even if we don't feel it."

What's happening here? There's no debating that our spiritual desolation is a trial but consider these truths of faith: 1) Our spiritual desolation this day, this evening, in this time of prayer, at home, at work, is a trial that the Lord who loves us and whose providence guides us, is permitting us to undergo. This trial is not useless pain, it has meaning within God's loving plan for us. 2) The reason why God asks us to undergo this trial is so that we may learn to resist the devil. In fact, it's by resisting that we grow in the ability to resist. This is how saints are made. Each time we undergo a spiritual trial and resist it, we grow stronger to resist it in the future. 3) We can resist – We are not destined to helplessly succumb. We can come safely through this trial, because even though we do not feel it, God is giving us the grace to stand firm in our trial.

What to do? The next time we think, "I can't do this," remember these three truths. The enemy will want us to surrender and give up on our journey of faith, but we don't have to. Don't try to fight this desolation on your own. Speak to your priest, speak to your spouse, and let's walk forward together.
